TORONTO, Feb. 10—(CP)—The price tendency was upward on the Toronto Stock Exchange today with the golds making the best progress.

NEW YORK, Feb. 10—(AP)—It was another red stock and bond market today although a few utilities and scattered industrial specialties managed to get aboard the recovery excursion.

CHICAGO, Feb. 10—(AP)—Grains made an attempt to advance during the early part of the session today, but the markets strength faded and prices drifted back around previous closing levels.

WINNIPEG, Feb. 10—(CP)—Export wheat buyers representing the United Kingdom were again active today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange.

LONDON—(CP)—Five tons of sugar, rationed in war time, were stolen by thieves who drove it away in a truck. The truck was recovered empty a few hours later.

Officers Get Boost In Clothing Fund

OTTAWA, Feb. 8—(CP)—Defence headquarters tonight announced an adjustment in the clothing allowance for officers on active service whereby the amount paid an officer for his uniform allowance is increased to \$250, considered more commensurate with the cost.

The order, effective as of Jan. 19, is not retroactive. The announcement said an amendment to general orders increases the cash allowance from the \$150 which those officers on active service before Jan. 19 received to \$250, which is to be paid henceforth to incoming officers who are posted to and are serving in a unit of the Canadian (active) army.

For those officers called out for duty or placed on active service but not serving with a unit, the following allowance will be provided: \$100 on completion of three months' service, \$75 on completion of six months and \$50 on completion of 12 months' service.

The new rates apply as of Jan. 19. Before that date the payments were \$50 after three months' service, \$50 after six months and \$50 after 12 months. Minard's kills pain.

Malifax Man May Get Command Of New Can. Cruiser

LONDON, Feb. 8—(CP CABLE)—Capt. H. T. W. Grant, of Halifax, who commanded the British cruiser Enterprise in the Dec. 25 Bay of Biscay action, the Enterprise and H.M.S. Glasgow, another cruiser, sank three of 11 Nazi destroyers and routed the others, may be given the command of one of the new Royal Canadian Navy cruisers, according to reports current here.

The only Canadian commanding a cruiser, the 44-year-old Grant, would be a logical officer to take over one of the new cruisers. Grant, on loan to the Royal Navy from the R.C.N., took over the command of the Enterprise late last summer, after commanding the cruiser Diomed.
