J. W. BOULTER, the enterprising manager of the London Fence Machine Co. in this province was in the city yesterday. The Guardian has received a copy of the Devon and Exeter Gazette with a lengthy account of a sale at Exeter, Eng., in aid of a memorial pulpit in the parish church. BOSTON, December 9.—The six story brick chair factory of John A. Dunn, 197 Portland street, was burned today. The loss is estimated at \$125,000.

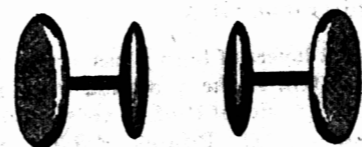
