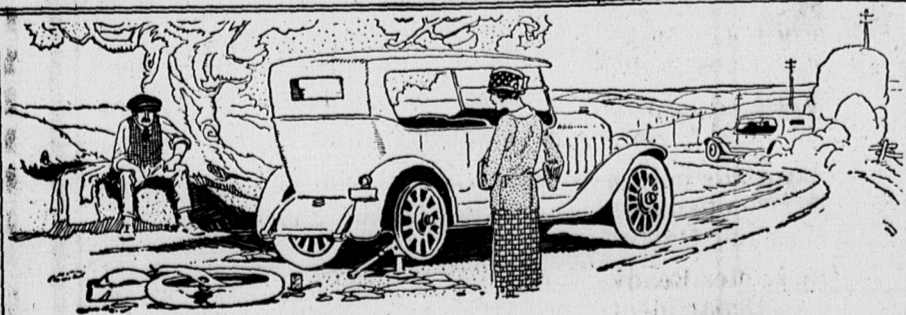

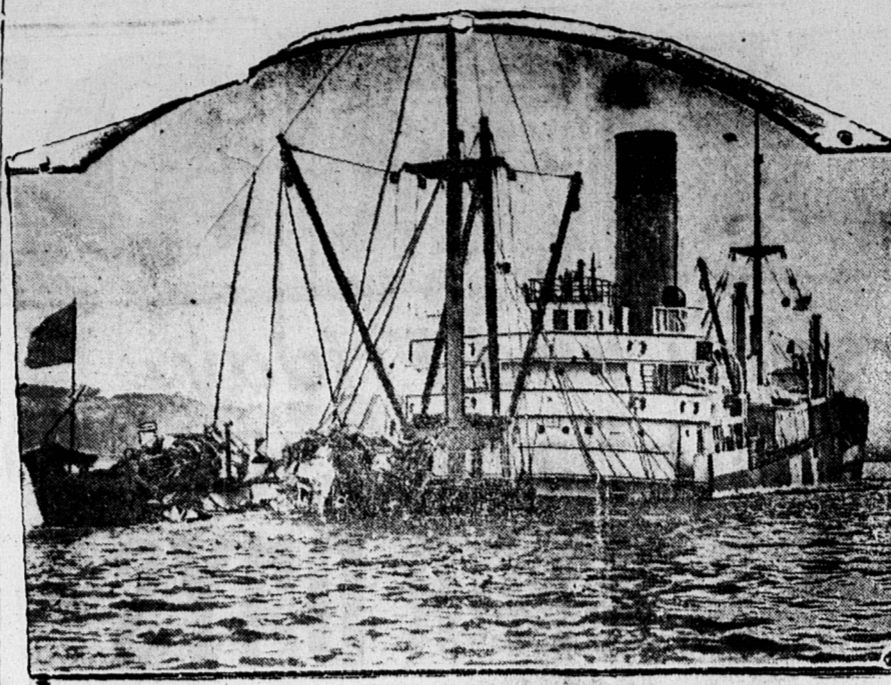

At present the brick-layers and carpenters are busy building a collection which will be completed in time for the National Dairy Show in October. Next year the horse show will be transferred from an all-day drill in the infield to this structure. It will also be put on at night, a change that will give everyone who is busy in other departments during the day an opportunity to see it.

On the opposite side of the track the carpenters are finishing the interior of a two-story house for the groomers who are located at the club. It is built into the long row of stabling which extends from the underpass near the club house around the upper turn of the race track.

In the infield of the mile track a flock of teams and steam shovels are preparing the bed of the seven furlong track which will, when completed, insure safe footing for racing even in the rain. This addition will also provide the fair association with a jogging course in all kinds of weather as well as a place where horses can be warmed up for their engagements during the progress of the fair.

move on to Cleveland for another trip down the line. Like other trainers he has had a few jars this spring by having horses which were heavily staked for him. While some of them will be missed the colors of the stable will be seen in the leading events on account of the double entries which were made at almost all of the towns between Cleveland and Lexington.

Iskander is the outstanding candidate for pacing honors that has been stopped. The absence of the "black horse" will be noted by many race-goers on account of the splendid series of races which he paced over the half-mile tracks in 1922. Murphy, however, is fortunate in having Lambert Todd to take his place. Pickel made a trip with him last year without losing an event. It is true that he did not meet such well known horses as Almaden and the late Albert or Peter Kennedy. But the same thing can be said of Frank Bogasl, Jr., an ex-member of the same outfit, and all the world knows the little gelding made good.

Lambert Todd was bred by Miss Katherine L. Wilks at Cruickston Farm, Galt, Ontario. He was got by Jim Todd out of Gracie Lambert by Oro Lambert. Nat Ray has a half-brother to him in his stable named Lambert. He is a gray and by Kentucky Todd out of Gracie Lambert. Both of them are named in the Chamber of Commerce Purse which will be decided at Syracuse in September.

Murphy has declared Peter Daw and Sillard out of their engagements. Julia Putt is also on the complaining list. If they have to be laid away they will like Iskander make material for 1924.

Peter Manning and Margaret Dillon are in perfect condition. The latter will be raced where there are events for free-for-all pacers. Peter Manning will after making a few time performances start to reduce his record of 1.56 1/2. He is the best that has been seen to date. Uhlun reached 1.58 in 1912. Nine years were required to find a horse to shade it. Peter Manning did it in 1921 when he trotted in 1.57 1/2. Last year he cut off a second. Some day he may reel off a mile in which the quarters will average twenty-nine seconds. That would cut his mark to 1.55.

Murphy will depend on Czar Worthy to maintain the stable honors in the free-for-alls. He is a speed merchant of the proper kind. With Peter Daw on the sidelines Murphy will start Worthy Son in many of the big events. He looks rather frail but those who saw him race in New England last fall know that he has a lot of whiz and can be depended on to give all that he has in the fastest company.

Rose Scott will not be started until late in the season unless she is entered in late closing events. The Kentucky Futurity winner of 1921 is one of four black trotters in the Murphy stable which attract considerable attention. One of the others is a sister to Rose Scott; the third is Hope Frisco with which Murphy won a number of three-year-old races last year, and the fourth is the ex-halt mile Belle-at-Law. This mare is by Binzara out of one of the few fillies which Heir-at-Law sired, while he was located in Massachusetts. Last season Belle-at-Law won three races in two weeks in the Bay State Circuit. She has the bulldog courage of the Mambrino Kings but possibly not as much speed as a few that could be named. Both Peter Etawah and Grace

Direct will make the grade with the fast pacers. The first named is now a four-year-old. The latter after touring the double ovals for three seasons is back in line ready to do battle with anything that comes along. Grace Direct is now nine years old. She shows few marks of the stiff campaign which she made since Tolley sold her at Atlanta.

Hal Abbe is still on the firing line. He recently made a trip to the Canadian border to have his papers renewed. They will cover his engagements as far as Lexington. Since going to Syracuse Murphy has also added the brown gelding Captain Bugle to his stable. He was bred by Captain David Shaw, and is by Count Dashoff, the sire of Plain Mac, out of Bugle Spler by Directum Spler. Like all of the Shaw products this gelding has a lot of speed and good manners. Mrs. Yerkes has also been transferred from the Tyson stable. She did very well on the half-mile tracks last year.

For the three-year-old pacing races Murphy has a filly by Peter Vol out of Lassie McGregor with which he defeated Peter Scott in the \$10,000 M. & M. at Detroit in 1914. The Belwin colt Conclave fell for the three-year-old trots. He is out of a mare by Axworthy. Murphy also has a three-year-old brother to Lee Axworthy in his stable. He is marked very much like his sire.

Guy Bacon is at present the pick of the two-year-olds. He is by Guy Axworthy out of Cream Silk, a member of the Soprano family. In an adjoining stall the stable visitors find Real Frisco by San Francisco, out of the dam of The Real Lady, and Peter Wallace by Chestnut Peter. Arion Guy will also join the Murphy stable at Cleveland. He will be given an opportunity to reduce his four-year-old record of 1.59 1/2.

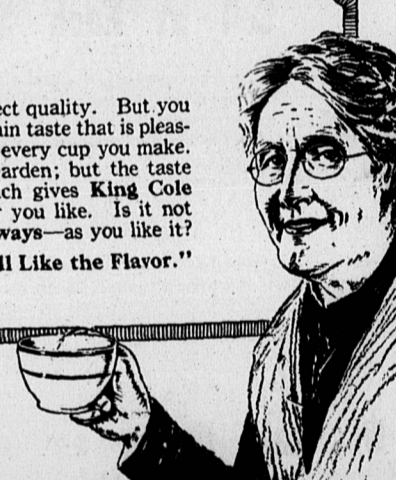
