Pine-to Sandwich Spread
1 cup chopped pimentos
1 cup ground onions
1 cup mild vinegar
1 cup sugar
1 teaspoon salt
2 tablespoons celery seed
3 tablespoons flour
1 tablespoon miserdard
2 tablespoons butter
Keeps indefinitely in sealed jar. Method: You buy the pimentos already canned and as they generally come in small tins, it will take about a couple of tins to measure out a couple of cups. If you have sweet red peppers, you could use those instead, draining them well and chopping fine.

They're easy to get into and comfortable to wear. Each features stay-up shoulders and a tie-sash to assure a firm fit. Both are full-skirted enough to top your most wide-hemmed dresses. Make the aprons in various colors and patterns. They're easy to keep a fresh one always on hand. Trim them with gay rib-rac or bright binding for a cheerful note. For Damp Walls
If you find that a damp patch on the wall persistently ruins your wallpaper, try this tip. Obtain some tar paper (which is black one side, and brown the other) from a decorator, remove the damp wallpaper, and paste a piece of tar paper over the patch. The black side should be against the wall. Then cover this with fresh wallpaper, and you'll never be troubled again.

England to-day is spending less money on groceries and more on meat, including poultry and rabbit.

Not quite as famous as its western brother, the Colorado river of Texas rises in the northwestern section of that state and empties into the Gulf of Mexico.

Spread on stained mattress a paste made of powdered Fuller's earth and water; leave till dry, about 25 hours, then brush off—a second application may be necessary.

When a lining of greaseproof paper is fitted inside a square or oblong cake-tin the strips of paper should be of double thickness and long enough to protect for an inch or more above the sides and ends of the tin. A lining of this sort prevents the cake from browning too soon at the top, and also keeps it from overflowing if it rises slightly above the edge of the tin.

When the cake is done it may be lifted out of the tin by means of the paper lining and placed on the wire cooling-tray.

TO CLEAN A WINE CASK
To clean a wine cask, put some hot cinders into it, pour over some boiling water containing a little vinegar, then scrub the cask thoroughly.

Rinse well with hot, then cold water, and put in the open air to dry.

Store candles in the refrigerator or lead four hours before lighting to make them burn evenly and to prevent bending. Candles that have been refrigerated also burn more slowly.

WASHING CHAMOIS CLOTH
Piece of chamolis used for polishing glass and silver were detested quickly if it is not washed according to the proper method. It should never be rubbed with soap, but squeezed in warm water never hot, together with soap-suds—several changes of soap-suds will be needed, according to the amount of dirt to be removed, and it is essential to see that all the changes of soap-suds and rinsing waters are of the same temperature.

No trace of soap must be left in the material after rinsing. Remove the water by pressing between the hands. Do not wring the leather, but shake and pull it before hanging it to dry in a good wind or in a strong sun. Pull and wring the leather frequently. It will then dry quite soft and clean like new.
