

# WORK OF THE .W. C. T. U.

Meeting Held in Montreal--Devotional Exercises Led by Mr. Strong of Summerside.

MONTREAL, Nov. 19.—Friday afternoon there was a large attendance of delegates and members of the W. C. T. U. in St. James Methodist Hall Mrs. A. O. Rutherford, the popular president, occupied the chair. After devotional exercises led by Mrs. Strong, president P. E. I., and routine business, the president presented to the audience Mrs. Leonora M. Lake, St. Louis, Mo., third vice president Catholic Total Abstinence Union of America, who was received with much warmth. Mrs. Lake, who was a friend of the late Miss Frances Willard, made a pleasing and eloquent speech on the work. In referring to the Catholicity of a cause which brings in all races and creeds, Mrs. Lake said one of the most encouraging letters she ever received was from Miss Willard, who said she thanked God for making "you a Catholic and me a Methodist, sisters."

The report of the corresponding secretary was listened to with much interest. In the year 1900 there were 438 unions, 74 county unions, 10,600 active members, 1,782 honorary members 153 Bands of Hope, and 5,757 members of Bands of Hope. This year there are 446 unions, a decrease from last year, 45 county unions 10,080 active members, 1,833 honorary members, 150 Bands of Hope, with 6,994 members. The numbers of unions organized in 1900 was 38, and in 1901, 38.

### WORK OF THE PROVINCES.

In 1900 Nova Scotia had 39 unions 12 county unions 878 active members, 159 honorary members, 10 Bands of Hope, 483 members. New Brunswick had 40 unions, 13 county unions, 917 active members. Manitoba 42 unions (3 y's.) 583 active

members, 53 y's, 8 Bands of Hope with 345 members. British Columbia had 22 unions, with 3 y's, 427 active members, 83 y's, 128 honorary members and 4 Bands of Hope with 287 members, Prince Edward Island had 5 unions, 2 y's, 183 actual members; Ontario had 233 unions, with 26 y's, 33 county unions, 5,883 active members, with 585 y's, 359 honorary members, 74 Bands of Hope with 5,487 y's. Quebec had 104 unions, 16 county unions, 2,324 active members, 357 honorary members, 54 Bands of Hope with a membership of 1,668. The Northwest Territories had 8 unions, 135 active members, 15 honorary members, 3 Bands of Hope, with a membership of 187.

### IN NOVA SCOTIA.

In 1901 Nova Scotia had 23 unions 8 y's, 682 active members, 204 y's, 142 honorary members, 7 Bands of Hope and 312 members. New Brunswick had 31 unions, 3 y's, 639 active members, 53 y's, 59 honorary members, 1 Band of Hope and 618 members. Manitoba has 34 unions 3 y's, 559 active members, 31 y's, 191 honorary members, 7 Bands of Hope with 501 members. British Columbia has 19 unions, 334 active members, 53 honorary members, 5 Bands of Hope, with 106 members. Prince Edward Island has 4 unions, 2 y's, 145 active members, 30 y's, Ontario has 222 unions, 33 county unions, 5,342 members, 1,077 honorary members, 68 Bands of Hope with 4,159 members. Quebec has 101 unions, 8 y's, 12 county unions, 2,048 active members, 315 honorary members, 58 Bands of Hope, with 1,886 members. The Northwest Territories have 7 unions with 140 active members and 3 Bands of Hope.
