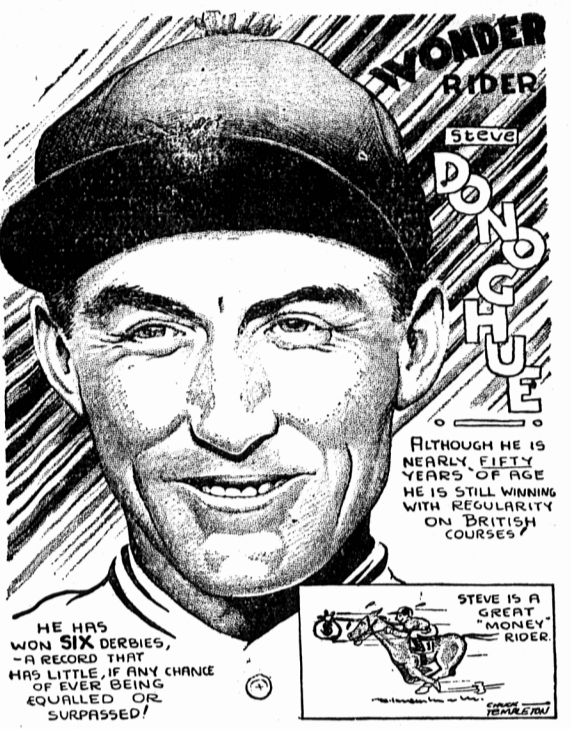

Blank Dominion Team 5-0 In Third Game Of Series

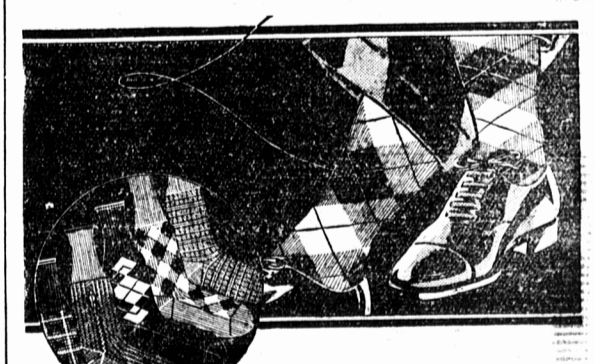
Purney Fuller Lets Conquerors Of Springhill Down With But Five Hits. Second Shutout For Winners In Three Games.
