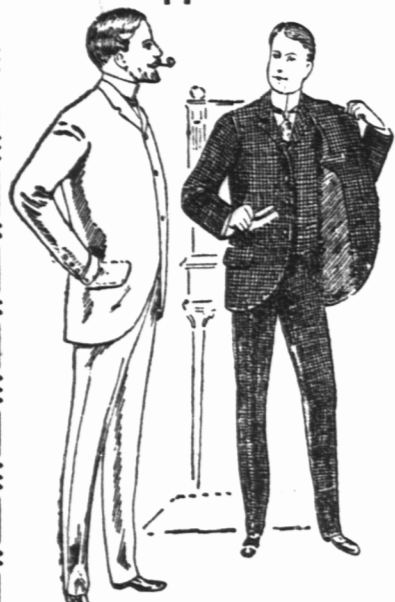

NEXT Friday evening is expected to be an exciting day at Ross's Corner Bedeque. Two bicycle road races have been arranged for, the first open to all who never did any track racing, and to start at 6 o'clock, the second open to all Amateurs and to start at 7 o'clock. The course will be through Freetown and back a distance of 10 1/2 miles. The entrance fee 55 cts, will require to be paid to the secretary, Mr Geo H Ross of Ross's Corner, no later than Wednesday evening.

The regular meeting of the Town Council was held Monday evening, the chairman and all the councillors being present. There was no business of any importance before the meeting. The usual monthly bills were read and passed. An informal discussion took place relative to the lighting of the town, it being stated that complaints had been made to some of the councillors. It was left with the chairman to interview the manager of the electric lights with reference to the matter.

The meeting in the Y. M. C. A. Hall Monday evening, to consider the Plebiscite Campaign was a large and influential one. Mr. R. McC. Stavert presided. Messrs. Mollison, Russ, J. M. Clark, D. Montgomery, Rev Dr Sprague, Rev E H Grant and others gave lively addresses on the subject each emphasizing the necessity of organization. A committee was appointed to assist in bringing about the immediate organization of the East Riding in Prince County. The committee are Messrs. R McC. Stavert, J M Clark, Rev Mr Grant, R H Campbell.

EARLY Sunday morning there died at the residence of his son, J. Herbert Hisslam, Headingly, at the advanced age of 81 years, Thomas Haslam, who for the past two years has resided in Manitoba. Mr Haslam was a native of Queen's county, Ireland, but removed at a very early age with his parents to Prince Edward Island, where his family took up land and where they now farm a considerable portion of the community. Mr Haslam, in spite of his advanced age, was active up till about two years ago, since which time he has been gradually failing, though only confined to his bed for the past week. The cause of the death was old age, represented in a general breaking down of the system. The funeral takes place to Headingly cemetery at 3 o'clock today. Rev A E Cowley, of St James, conducts the service—Winnipeg Tribune, August 12th.
