Williams Leads American Batters Despite Slump

CHICAGO, July 6 — (AP) — Boston's pace-setting Ted Williams did a 29-point nose-dive in the American League batting race last week, plunging from .415 to .386.

The Beantown batter, however, still held first place by 26 points over runner-up Lou Boudreau, Cleveland shortstop-manager, who had .360.

Williams cooled off with only five hits in 29 trips in his poorest week since he began his "blazing drive into the 400s."

Third behind Boudreau through Monday's games was Al Zarilla of St. Louis with .342. New York's Bobby Brown was fourth with .324, followed by Luke Appling, Chicago .319; Johnny Lindell, New York, .312; Walt Evers, Detroit, .307; Barney McCoskey, Philadelphia, .306; George Kell, Detroit, .304; and Joe DiMaggio, New York, and Bo Dillinger, St. Louis, each with .299.
