IS THE WAR AT AN END?

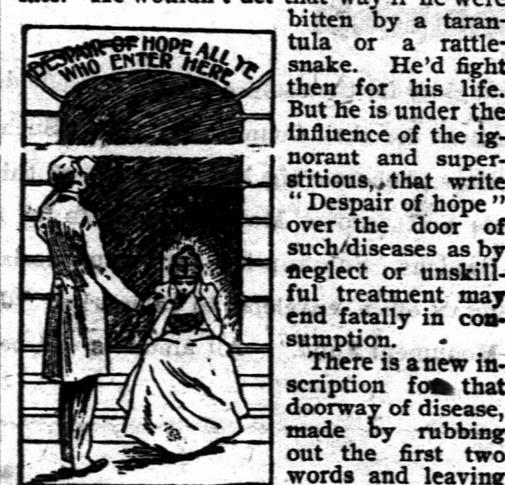
The "War is ended" and to celebrate that happy conclusion the Filipinos have just carried off a whole company of American soldiers.—Boston Traveller.

S. A. GOLD MEDAL.

The Salvation Army has been awarded a gold medal at the Paris Exhibition for their American exhibit showing the methods adopted by them in their work of acclamation of the fallen and outcast.
