BURTONS in the city find Nova Scotia live beef scarce, and importation from Ontario has been begun in order to supply the demand of consumers. The meat dealers here claim the Nova Scotia cattle are being held for high figures, which in view of the state of the market cannot be paid. They say that while at this time last year meat was high and good price rule, this year beef is lower, but that the provincial cattle owners are demanding the same price as last year. The city dealers would like to get Nova Scotia cattle, but feel that they would cost at the present asked much more than the Upper Canadian beef. Arrangements have therefore been made for shipment of cars of live cattle to Halifax each week.—Halifax Herald.
