FINANCIAL NEWS BRIEFS

MONTREAL, Oct. 2—Can. Power and Paper Investment—For year ended July earnings were \$70,085 available for debenture interest \$60,000 before income tax and depreciation on investment securities of \$25,000, earnings covered debenture interest 1.16 times against 0.78 times in previous year. Debentures of \$582,000 were retired during year and market value of investments increased from \$2,276,000 to \$2,610,000.

Tamblyn Limited—Total sales for third quarter considerably ahead same period last year. Earnings continuing at satisfactory rate.

Burlington Steel—Good volume business first nine months, satisfactory outlook for balance of year.

Dominion Coal—Sept output 3,850,000 tons up 3 per cent from Sept. 1936 down 4 per cent from August year.

Car Loadings—In Canada week ended Sept. 25 up 6 per cent from same week 1936, despite drop in grain loadings. In U. S. for same week 840,000 a gain of 1.7 per cent over preceding week and 4 per cent over same week 1936.

Copper Output Restriction—Principal copper producing companies operating outside United States agree to cut out rate to prevent accumulation of excess stocks.

French Cabinet Meeting—Paris—The Cabinet after a three hour meeting on the financial situation today issued a formal declaration asserting that the position was sound and that therefore there was no basis for heaviness of the franc except exchange or for

speculation of the franc. Coincidentally the Cabinet announced six resolutions providing measures to deal with the situation.

NEW YORK, Sept. 2—Possible tie up of all operations in Mexico of American Smelting and Refining was indicated by the break up of conferences between representatives of company, syndicate of miners and the Mexican Labor Department. Syndicate has called for a big demonstration on Sunday against the company with the purpose of forcing the firm to negotiate a new collective contract with its workers. U. S. Federal Government can show a cash surplus of about \$150,000,000 on its budgetary operations for the recently closed first quarter of the current fiscal year. The first surplus recorded since 1931 a survey of treasury accounts shows. This surplus does not include sums spent to buy and sterilize gold but if allowance is made for the \$300,000,000 of gold released from sterilization during the quarter the Treasury still has a cash surplus of about \$300,000,000 after paying for all operations including gold sterilizations.

NEW YORK, Oct. 2—The French Cabinet met for three hours today. After the meeting a formal statement was issued which said there was no cause for heaviness of the franc. Cabinet also issued a policy which which it would follow stressing six points. The Amsterdam market, according to Dow Jones, is lower. Yesterday's New York market showed very little, and consequently we would look on over the week end. We believe the U. S. steel and volume indications the best guides to the immediate trend.

NEW YORK, Oct. 2—The market was irregular at times yesterday but the close was firm to strong and the bear party does not seem to be making any headway. The copper shares which have been under real pressure owing to the abrupt cut in the metal price now suggest that this cut was somewhat overdone and the controlling interests seek rather to have favorable market at fair prices than any such buying spurge as took place last spring. We think this section of the market due for some bullish attention and certainly regard American Smelting, U. S. Smelting and Cerro de Pasco as well worth holding, while we would do some trading from time to time in Anaconda, Kennecott and Phelps Dodge, buying when under pressure for fair turns. Gold mining stocks stood out again in the market. Dome gained on the day plus dividend. McIntyre was strong, we like these stocks especially as there is renewed demand for choice gold stocks abroad. The oils are steady and would continue to buy them when weak in any depressed general market. General Motors and Chrysler, U. S. Steel and Bethlehem, and Rolling Mills, Westinghouse and Allis Chalmers suggest buying the fair dips for trading.

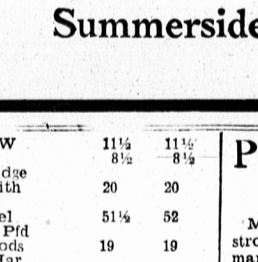

Produce Prices

(By The Canadian Press) Montreal, Oct. 3—Butter was strong on Montreal open produce markets this week with eggs firm and potatoes steady.

Graded egg shipments in carlots or less were quoted at 36 to 37 cts a dozen for grade A-large, 34 to 35 for A-medium, 30 for A-pullets, 26 for B-large and 21 for C.

Butter was quoted at 27 3-8 to 5-8 cents a pound for carlots or less of No. 1 while lots to retailers were 28 1-2 for solids and 29 for prints.

Cheese was quoted at 14 1-4 to 3-8 cents a pound for Ontario whites with coloreds at 14 1-2 to 5-8. Quebecs were sold at 14 for whites and 14 1-2 for coloreds.

Potatoes: N. B. new whites No. 1 80's 50 to 55; No. 2 80's 35 to 45; N. B. Cobblers No. 1 80's 60 to 65; P. E. I. new whites No. 1 90's 75 to 80.

TORONTO, Oct. 3—(CP) — Base metal shares took the limelight on Toronto mining market Saturday and featured the dull session with a sizeable rally. Golds showed mixed action and changes were generally narrow.

Noranda added a point and Waite Amulet, Base Metals, Falconbridge, Pend Oreille, Mandy and Sudbury Basin were in demand. Hudson Bay softened a little.

Realizing sales toppled most senior golds. Lake Shore and Dome dropped major fractions and Bralorne, Sylvanite and Teck Hughes ruled lower. O'Brien and Wright-Hargreaves added a few cents.

Jellicoe's gain of 9 to 9 1/2 was the largest change among cheap gold issues. Bidgood, Central Patricia, Francoeur, Uchi, Laguna and Midsen edged higher with Beattie, Hard Rock, Howey, Moneta, God's Lake, Lava Cap and Canadian Malartic among the listings to drop a few cents.
