PROGRESS OF THE WAR.

It is quite possible that the brilliant opening of the war on the part of the Japanese may have raised expectations in regard to the future which may not be realised. The world has been dazzled by the splendid achievement which beginning on Monday night, in the first twenty four hours put eleven Russian warships out of action or captured them outright. This news was followed two days later by an account of the renewed attack upon Port Arthur with the capture of "seven Russian ships." Nothing since to hand has either confirmed or denied this later reported victory or given us any account as to the sort of ships captured, whether large or small, or indeed, whether they were war ships or merchant vessels. And yesterday's despatches give the doubtful announcement of three cruisers of the Russian Vladivostok squadron blown up by torpedoes while passing through Tsagaru straits. It is however quite certain that Russia has, for the time at least, lost control of the sea in the east.

But it is to be observed that even if Russian naval power in the far east has been so far crippled as to be unable to take and keep the open sea, Russia is still a much more formidable naval power than Japan. She has in her Baltic fleet alone a very formidable naval force and it has already set out for the scene of conflict, said to consist of fifteen battleships and cruisers. As their speed would be that of the slowest vessel it might take them six weeks to reach Port Arthur, even if not intercepted and compelled to fight on the way. Their safe arrival in the Yellow Sea would probably turn the scale of naval strength again in favor of Russia. It therefore seems probable that the Russian ships still at Port Arthur

and Vladivostok will remain under shelter of the shore batteries until the Baltic fleet shall arrive on the scene, or be otherwise disposed of.

It is probable also that in an emergency Russia's Black Sea fleet would be released, and it is not improbable that when the Baltic fleet is passing through the Mediterranean it may be joined by the ships from the Black Sea. These combined fleets, if permitted to reach the east would quite dominate the situation there. Should the Baltic fleet go forward alone, which is most probable, Japan would be required to put forth her best efforts and the result might be doubtful, although her interior position, her great preponderance in torpedo craft and the wonderful skill and success with which she has so far utilised this arm of her naval service, might turn the scale in her favor. Russian losses at sea have indeed been so far appalling, but the end is not yet. It is on land that Russia is strongest and in a defensive war on land, should it come to that, Japan would have a very formidable, if not an almost impossible task to drive her from her strongly fortified positions in Manchuria and along the Tatu River.

AN ADDRESS TO HORACE HASZARD.

(From The Daily Examiner, Dec. 19th 1901.)

To HORACE HASZARD, Esq.,

We, the undersigned shipping merchants of Charlottetown and other parts of Prince Edward Island, desire at this time to express our sense of the great services you have rendered to the trade of this port in connection with the direct steam service between the Island and the Mother Country. It was largely through your foresight and thoughtfulness that the advantages of a direct steamer were brought before the public mind years ago, and it was mainly by your energetic and influential representations that the Dominion Government was induced to make the necessary grant towards making a trial of the direct service.

This was done under many difficulties and discouragements which might have deterred a less hopeful, energetic and persistent promoter than yourself. That the Dalton Hall has come even at this late season of the year and sails from our port with a large freight is again in a very large measure due to your enterprise and efforts which we feel are entitled to general and public recognition.

We trust that the benefit accruing to our shippers and producers, and to the general interests of the Island, from the experiments made so far, may result in a development of the service during future years so that we may have a series of direct trips by the steamers in the spring and fall seasons, at monthly or more frequent intervals. Such a service we are satisfied, would lead to a large and increasing direct trade, that would be of great importance and value to Prince Edward Island.
