A local newspaper there understands that a report has been made by an engineer who has covered all points suggested as possible ferry routes; that the examination was made during probably the most severe part of the winter; that a comparison of these routes confirms the contention that a much larger proportion of open water exists in Northumberland Strait between Capes and that the conditions of ice are such that the Straits are navigable at this point.
