THE COOK'S CORNER

BROILED BANANAS
 Broiled bananas only takes about half the time that most require. Of course, if the bananas are left whole they will take a while longer to become thoroughly cooked. Whole bananas take about 6 to 10 minutes. Quarter or lengthwise halves take from 3 to 5 minutes. All that is necessary is to brush the bananas with melted butter and sprinkle with a little salt before placing on the broiling rack.

Another nice way to serve bananas as an accompaniment to meat or fish is to cut them in short lengths, dip in cornmeal and fry to a golden brown in deep fat.

BANANA CUTLETS
 6 bananas
 1 egg
 1-2 teaspoons salt
 Cornmeal

Shortening or cooking oil
 Method: Use the bananas with slightly green tips for this. Peel the bananas and cut in about 1-1/2-inch lengths. Beat the egg with the salt and dip the banana segments in this and then in the cornmeal, coating each piece thoroughly.

Drop these in deep fat which has been heated to 375 deg. F. or until a day-old cube of bread will brown in 50 seconds. Fry to a golden brown and drain on ungreased paper.

APPLE POT PIE
 Four cups flour, 1 teaspoon salt, 1-2 cup butter, ice water, 6 large tart apples, 2-3 cup sugar, 2 teaspoon nutmeg, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1-4 cup flour.

Stir salt and butter together. Put in 1-2 cup of water and stir in enough water to moisten until it can be formed into a ball. Toss out on a floured board, roll thin and cut in two-inch squares. Pare, core and cut apples in small pieces. Alternate layers of apples and squares of dough in a kettle. Sprinkle the apple layers generously with the sugar and spice mixture. Pour a layer of dough on top and dot with butter. Half fill the kettle with water, cover and cook over low flame until apples are soft. Serve with cream.

You snip off its ends on a slant and cut the lower edge in a broad scallop. Sew the ruffle to this lower edge and stitch tape to the top edge; then drape swag and tack tape to valance board.

Measuring the side draperies, add two inches for shrinkage and take them up in a tuck near the top. When you sew the ruffles on, allow plenty of fullness at the corners to prevent "hooping."
