**THE advance party** from the Royal Garrison Artillery, consisting of fourteen men, arrived Tuesday and immediately proceeded to Fort Dufferin to get things in readiness for the main body of sixty and the local P. E. I. men who will camp there. They were met by **Col. A. J. Armstrong**, **Col. White** and **Sergt. Smith**, who accompanied them to the camp. Tents were pitched and the other members of the permanent force arrived at three o'clock this afternoon, the train being two hours late, and proceeded to the fort, where the whole party will work at getting things in shape, mounting the guns, etc., so that practice and competitive firing may be started on August 1st, Monday. As yet there are no guns at the fort. The twelve and six-pound quick-firing guns and the two 4.7 guns at present in the shed at Lower Cove will probably go over to the fort Thursday and the six and twelve-pound guns from Prince Edward Island are expected to arrive this afternoon.—**St. John Globe.**

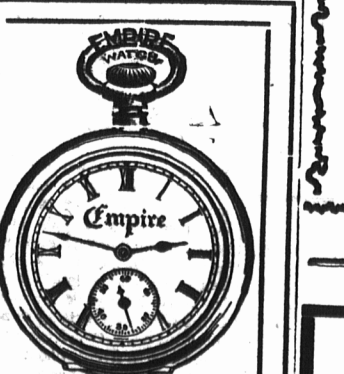
