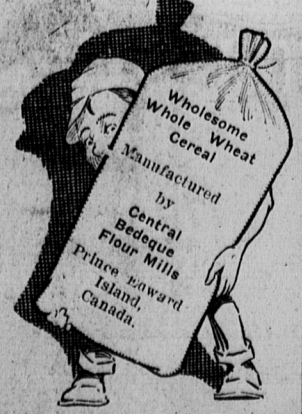

Now that the ban is lifted and the police have been relieved of the shooting of dogs they might take on the duty of endeavoring to find out who is putting out the poison for these dogs. There are some valuable dogs in Summerside and it is also other dogs of very little commercial value but very much liked by their owners who would be sorry to lose them. Perhaps if a branch of the Kennel Club were formed here the dog owners might co-operate and employ some one to catch these poison culprits.
