## An Incident of the Great Chicago Fire.

Mr. Ira D. Sankey, in writing of the life of D. L. Moody by his son, speaks of an notable meeting as follows:

"I can recall no more striking incident in the history of Mr. Moody's meetings than that which took place the night of the great Chicago fire in 1871. Mr. Moody and I were conducting a large meeting in the old Farwell Hall. After a moving sermon by Mr. Moody, he called upon me to sing. Everything was quiet in the streets outside, and no particular incident influenced me in the choice of a song. This however, was what I happened to select:

"To-day the Saviour calls, for refuge fly.  
The storms of justice fall and death is nigh.  
The echoes of the song had scarce'y ceased to reverberate in the building when the old court-bell near by began to ring, sounding the alarm of fire. It was the death-knell of the city. The noise and confusion were so great that the meeting had to be adjourned. Mr. Moody and I stood outside the building watching the flames, and when we parted that night it was not to meet again for a month. Farwell Hall was in ashes next morning."

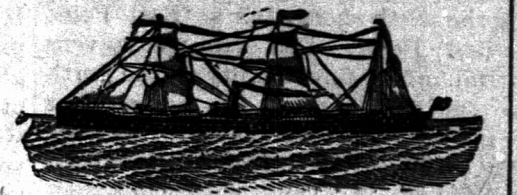
