Noranda suffered the heaviest selling off \$1.50 to \$3.00. While Nickel after going off \$1.75 from \$3.00, recovered at the close to \$3.90. The other Base Metal stocks were down fractionally lower. A couple of the cheap stocks notably Manitoba Basin and Newbec, were quite a bit stronger.

Among the golds, Dome was very steady at \$7.25, while Lake Shore, after selling at \$20.00, dropped to \$19.75, the others were unchanged.

The Oil stocks did not do so well. Ajax was under pressure and provided the largest number of shares traded in. Rumors in regard to number 6 well resulted in the stock dropping 50 cents from \$2.00 because of strife within the Company. A. P. C. broke to \$1.85. Calmont made a new low of \$1.23 and others were unchanged or fractionally lower.

There was little change in the big Oils. B. A. O. down 80 cents, Imperial steady, and Int. Pete. gained 25 cents on the day.

GERMANS AIM BLOW AT BRITISH COAL

LONDON, Nov. 25.—The British coal industry has sustained another heavy blow as the result of an increase in German rail rates. Yorkshire shire exporters say their trade with German buyers was increasing by leaps and bounds, when the embargo was applied. Now that excellent business has come to an abrupt end.

The Government hold that if the increased rates had been aimed directly at British coal it might possibly have intervened, but the German railways, when announcing the new sliding scale which advances the rate per ton considerably after a certain length of haul, simply said "foreign coal," which includes the Dutch and Polish as well as the British product.
