EGG LAYING CONTEST
Notes on the P. E. Island Egg Laying Contest for the week ending March 12, 1928.
Mr. Everett Howatt's White Leghorns led the contest for the week with 60.8 points; the Experimental were second, with 56 points; Mr. Talmage Foster's Barred Rocks were third, with 51 points; and Mrs. J. F. Easton's White Leghorns were fourth with 52.3 points by Miss Thelma Ballen for which she gave a beautiful prize. The Rock hen No. 10 leads the contest to date for individual production, with 101.5 points; the Medal Poul try Yards Barred Rock hen No. 2, pen 7, is second, with 99.3 points; the Kensington Baby Chick Hatchery's Hen No. 3 is third with 97.2 points; and Mrs. J. F. Easton's White Leghorn hen No. 1 is fourth, with 93.1 points.
The pens leading in total production to date are as follows:
First Model Poultry Yards, B.R. Pen No. 7, 611.1 points;
Second Mr. Talmage Foster's Barred Rocks 627.1 points;
Third Mr. S. R. Pendleton's Barred Rocks 510.3 points;
Fourth Experimental Station's W. L. Pen No. 3, 509.7 points;
Fifth K. B. C. Hatchery's Barred Rocks 508.3 points.
The total production for the week was 745 eggs, and to date, 8045 eggs.
