**ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST**  
Reporters and Correspondents Everywhere.

At the police court yesterday morning James Prowse for drunkenness was fined \$2 or 10 days.

The water pipes of the city were flushed out yesterday morning. That something unusual was going on was apparent at the different facets by the quantity of muddy water. Those who had not settled for their water supply feared that the worst had come and hastened to pay up, complaining that the office was prompt in taking action on the last day of grace.

On Wednesday, July 23rd, Branch, No. 231 C. M. B. A. will hold a tea on the church grounds at Tignish. The committee in charge are arranging for the entertainment of thousands who it is expected will be present. In the past Tignish has enjoyed an enviable position in regard to the holding of tea parties and it is the intention of the management to spare no pains to make the C. M. B. A. tea of July 23rd exceed anything yet held in that part of the province. A special train has been arranged to leave Charlottetown at an early hour which will give an opportunity to all to see the western part of the province. A schedule of reduced fares will be advertised later.

No better evidence for the healthfulness of the climate of P. E. Island is needed than the longevity of her sons and daughters. The beauty of scenery seems to aid in sprightliness of step and and brightness of eye, as St. Peter's Bay not only has reputation for beauty but the youthful appearances of her aged residents. Chief among the old landmarks of that place is Mr. Wm. Bowley who recently celebrated at his hospitable home his eighty-sixth birthday. The event was one of pleasure to himself and friends. The presents he received were an evidence of the esteem in which this bright looking, active octogenarian is held in the community. A beautiful armchair the gift of his nephews and nieces deserves special mention. The community wishes him many years of continued health and prosperity.

Mr. A. Stronach, inspector of rolling stock for the C. P. R. is visiting Halifax for a few days, after a long absence from the Province, in Manitoba and other parts of the West. Mr. Stronach was mechanical superintendent and store keeper of the P. E. I. Railway for a number of years prior to 1881. In that year he went west for the Dominion Government as inspector of Government rolling stock on the Western Division. When the road was turned over to the C. P. R. in 1883, he entered the employ of that great corporation and has been with them ever since. For some time he filled the position of Lacy Johnson, mechanical superintendent, while the latter was absent in China. This is Mr. Stronach's first visit here since he entered the employ of the C. P. R. He gives a bright account of the prospects in the West. The C. P. R. has never been so busy during his nineteen years' experience with them as during the past year. There has been a great increase in immigration. The Americans who have gone into the Northwest are inducing many of their friends to come under the Canadian flag, and the Government is offering them every inducement and giving them great freedom in the matter of allowing them to bring in duty free all kinds of material and implements for use in their new homes. The crop prospects are favourable, although the weather has been just a back ward there as here. The C. P. R. is making preparations already to move the crops and has given large orders for engines and cars and is arranging to borrow others. There is a greatly increased acreage over last year. A few weeks ago Mr. Stronach said, immense trains hauled by two engines were coming over the Soo line into Moose Jaw hauling farmers outfits. Mr Stronach will be in the Province for a couple of weeks, after which he will return home to the West.—Halifax Chronicle.
