BELIEVED IN CANADA.

Sir Thomas Skinner Has Been Justified of Faith in Dominion.

Sir Thomas Skinner, Bart, who recently was appointed governor of the Hudson Bay Company, to succeed the late Lord Strathcona, although not a Canadian, has been so long identified with Canadian affairs that his name is familiar to most of the people of the Dominion. Says Chesterfield in The Family Herald: "When the preliminary plans for the development of the Canadian West were in the making, and when those who had decided to risk their all upon the construction of the Canadian Pacific Railway realized the need of strong support at the world's financial centre, London, Sir Thomas, or Mr. Skinner, as he was then, was approached and asked to interest himself and the strong commercial and financial circles in which he moved with Canada and Canadian affairs. Especially was the need in London of a strongly-held publication to expound Canadian matters and to defend Canadian projects realized, and Mr. Skinner agreed to supply this need, establishing the well-known Canadian Gazette, as the weekly journal of information and comment upon matters of use and interest to those concerned in Canada, Canadian emigration and Canadian investment," a journal which is still published.

Later Sir Thomas became a director of the Canadian Pacific Railway and numerous other business concerns. He was appointed by Queen Victoria to be a member of the Colonization Board, established for the purpose of assisting colonization in Canada from the congested districts of Scotland and Ireland. He presented a handsome chain and badge of office to the president of the Canada Club in London. In fact, Sir Thomas has never lost an opportunity to show his interest in Canada. He describes himself as "editor, publisher, promoter and capitalist." He is an Englishman by birth and descent, a son of James Skinner, of Bristol. He was born in the west country seaport town seventy-four years ago. Having frequently visited Canada, and taking great pleasure in entertaining Canadians who visit England, he is better known throughout the Dominion than many native Canadians. According to all accounts, Canada has well repaid Sir Thomas for his friendly interest, and a goodly part of his wealth, which is extensive, is due to his Canadian financial and industrial investments.

Man's Mouth Enlarged.

A most unusual operation, by which a man's mouth has been enlarged, has been successfully performed at Victoria Hospital in London by Dr. Edwin Seabourne of that city, upon L. Payzell, of St. Thomas, an Italian, who was badly burned by a gasoline explosion some three months ago. Payzell's face and head were frightfully burned, and while he recovered his health he was very badly disfigured. His skin and flesh were drawn in a horrible manner, and his mouth was afterward of only sufficient size to admit a small finger. Payzell found it practically impossible to consume ordinary food, and he was brought to London that his facilities in this regard might be improved. Dr. Seabourne took charge of the case and by slitting the cheeks on either side of the small aperture made a mouth of normal size.
