Polio Cases

In the early part of June four cases of poliomyelitis were diagnosed around Vernon Bridge. Then more than four weeks elapsed before further cases were reported in the Montserrat area.

Out of this number 13 have died. The ages are interesting.

0 under 5 years. 2 between 5 years and 10 years. 6 between 10 years and 20 years. 2 between 20 years and 30 years. 3 between 30 years and 40 years.
