PAINTS IN HER TUB, SAVED BY BURGLAR

(N. Y. Herald.)

James Ferrick, of No. 302 East 106th street, stopped to save Mrs. Annelise Cassello from drowning, after he had surprised her at her bath in her home, at No. 204 East 109th street, yesterday afternoon, and he is now a prisoner in the East 104th street police station, charged with burglary.

From admissions made by Ferrick to the police, he was in the Cassello apartments on a burglarious mission when he inadvertently strayed into the bathroom and met his Waterloo. On seeing the intruder, Mrs. Cassello screamed, then fainted and sank. Ferrick was about to bolt when he realized that the woman was drowning. At the risk of his liberty he seized Mrs. Cassello by the hair and held her above the water as he shouted for help. His cries brought Mrs. Rose Tarbell, mother of Mrs. Cassello, to the scene. At sight of Ferrick, Mrs. Tarbell ran screaming to a window, shouting that her daughter was being murdered.

Ferrick sought to drag the unconscious woman from the bathtub, but she was too heavy for him. He managed to get her arms above the edge and then removed the plug, permitting the water to escape. Satisfied that the woman was in no further danger, Ferrick ran to a first-aid shop and reached the street without being molested.

When the police arrived Mrs. Cassello was still unconscious. A physician was summoned and she revived. She gave a description of the burglar and an alarm was sent out for his arrest. Meanwhile, Ferrick had entered a building at Park avenue and 111th street, and was just leaving this when he met Policeman Bromner, whose suspicions were aroused. He halted Ferrick, and was questioning him, when two policemen, who had been furnished with Ferrick's description, joined them.
