A POINT WELL TAKEN.

A good point was made by Mr. Hughes in the debate on Wednesday evening that was not so fully brought out in our report of the Legislature's proceedings as we could have desired. Last summer a meeting of the Municipal Association of Canada was held in a western city and was attended by a delegation from Charlottetown City Council, composed of the Mayor, Councillors Paton and Whear. A prime object of the Municipal Association is to protect the civic and county municipalities against the improper interference of the Legislatures of any of the Provinces. The Association stands for the protection of municipal rights, precisely as the Provincial Legislatures stand, and ought to stand for Provincial rights.

Mr. Hughes' point was that after attending for the first time the meeting of the Municipal Association, Mr. Whear had immediately entered upon a course designed to strip the City Council of certain powers and transfer these powers to the Legislature. He is not defending civic rights, which as a City Councillor, he is bound to do, but is moving to denude the City of a rightful power, and also to prevent the citizens at large from having any voice in a matter which vitally affects their interests. The point was well taken and ought to have weight with the Legislature.

Japan is about to hold for the first time a World's Exhibition, open to all nations. It is to be held in Osaka, a city with nearly a million inhabitants, which has been called the Chicago of Japan on account of its pushing spirit. It boasts of many large manufacturing establishments. Here for the first time on their own ground Oriental native art and industry will challenge comparison with the best the Occident can produce. The fair will not be on so extended a scale as the Pan-American at Buffalo, but it will be much the greatest ever held in the far east, and of notable and world-wide interest.

It is a matter of common report which we believe to be well-founded that several of the buying agents of the Dominion Packing Company, who have thus a profitable and advantageous connection with the Company, have seats in the Legislative Assembly. There is nothing unlawful in this. For that matter the Manager of the Packing Company, had he been duly elected might so far as the law of the land is concerned, sit and vote in the House. Nor is there anything dishonorable in this. Some of the foremost men in the Canadian Commons have been solicitors, agents or employees of leading railway and industrial corporations. But such members obviously do not stand upon precisely the same footing as other members of the House when a matter affecting the company with which they are connected is under discussion or consideration. This is a point well worth bearing in mind by the independent and disinterested members of the Legislature at the present juncture. If the interested ones should also be found to be the most active and zealous in the Company's interest, one reason for their activity and zeal would naturally and easily be guessed.
