THE RUSSIAN DENIAL.

Of course, the news of the Russian demands in regard to Manchuria were given to the outside world from Chinese sources. And if Russian diplomacy in the past has proven to be in many cases false and deceptive, Chinese diplomacy has also frequently proved unreliable. At this stage, therefore, it is not greatly surprising that the Russian Foreign Office has quite emphatically denied pretty much the whole story as sent abroad from Peking. And with so much accomplished and expert mendacity upon both sides it seems a difficult task for outside nations to ascertain what are the facts of the case. Of course only the publication of the full text of the Russian demands, if it could be had, would show whether the Muscovite or the Mongolian liar is the truer successor of Ananias and Munchausen.

Here is a synopsis of the Chinese version of the more important Russian demands:—First, that no more Manchurian ports or towns are to be opened to trade; second, that no more foreign consuls are to be admitted into Manchuria; third, that no foreigners, except Russians, are to be employed in the public service in that district; seventh, that Russia is to be allowed to attach wires to the telegraph poles

of all Chinese lines in Manchuria; and eighth, that no Manchurian territory is to be alienated to any other power. And here is the substance of the denial from the Russian Foreign Office: That the report of the first demand as above stated is absolutely false. The second matter, the admission of foreign consuls, has not been mentioned in the negotiations with China; the third is false; the seventh is false, and as to the eighth, it is merely another way of phrasing the integrity of China, which Russia in her convention of April 8, 1902, adopted as a part of her program.

The Russian disclaimer is no doubt a rather amazing one. But it still leaves the world in doubt as to what demands were actually made by Russia. There seems to be fair reason for believing that some important demands have been made which China has refused to concede, and this although China had affected to believe that Russia was her best friend among the powers. It may take a long while to unravel the mystery fully. In the meantime the Russian denial will probably have the immediate effect of warding off the contemplated joint protest of Britain, Japan, the United States and Italy. It also makes the situation appear for the moment less critical, but it by no means clears it of the atmosphere of suspicion.

The Budget debate is still going on, not in the Legislature but in the Patriot.

Says the St. John Globe:—Prince Edward Island legislators must mend their ways, or they will be classed with the members of the Illinois legislature whose misconduct last week was blazoned all over the country.

It now appears that Christopher Robinson, K. C. will not be able to assist in conducting the Island representation case before the Supreme Court of Canada, as had been arranged. He has been called to England in connection with the Alaskan boundary affair. A. B. Aylesworth, K. C. of Toronto has been now retained to assist Attorney General Peters, and E. B. Williams of McKinnon & Williams of this city will assist in the preparation of the case. The brief is understood to be now in an advanced state of readiness.

So far as appears outwardly there is no special significance attaching to the King's visit to the courts of Lisbon, Rome and Paris. Portugal has been a distinctly friendly power for years past as Italy has also been. His Majesty has for almost a generation enjoyed a considerable personal popularity in Paris, and he no doubt desires to strengthen the friendly relations now existing between the British and French peoples. The royal visit may be hoped to accomplish something in that way. It is gratifying to read the many evidences of popular favor with which the King has been everywhere received during his tour on the Continent. His return to London is expected today, should nothing unforeseen occur to prevent.
