Mr. Donald Cahill Passes At S'side

The death occurred at the Prince County Hospital on Wednesday, December fourth, of Mr. Donald Cahill after an illness of about three weeks.

Lieut. Norman Wright and Mrs. Wright have returned to Halifax after a brief visit with their parents, Mr. and Mrs. Albert E. Wright, Central Boqueue.

During the past sixty years this congregation has been served by eleven ministers, as well as supplies between pastures, as follows:

Reverends J. A. MacLeod, 1889-1895; Charles MacKay, 1896-1900; Edwin Smith, 1900-1903; A. D. Stirling, 1904-1910; G. A. Smith, 1911-1916; T. W. Goodwill, 1917-1921; and A. W. Robertson, 1922-1925.

Following the disruption of 1925, Rev. M. E. Genge, D. D. and Rev. Fred Williamson supplied until the induction of Rev. T. L. Williams, 1926-1930.

Rev. D. L. Griffiths and Rev. C. R. Ashdown, supplied until the coming of Rev. W. O. Rhoad, D.D., 1931-1934; Rev. Gordon Nicol, 1934-1942; and Rev. J. M. MacGowan, 1942 to the present time.

The present elders are: Alex Hill, Thos. L. Ramsay, William Slavert, John Burrows, Roy MacArthur and Isaac Walker.

This church was completely re-decorated within and without in 1926 and again in 1945.

An unique feature of the anniversary was the presence in the choir of Mrs. Robert Bowness and John Geddie Townsend, who assisted in the leading of praise in the service at the opening sixty years ago.

Presbyterian Church At Kensington Marks Its 60th Anniversary

The sixtieth anniversary of the dedication of the Kensington Presbyterian Church was observed on Sunday last when Rev. J. M. MacGowan was assisted in the services by Rev. T. W. Goodwill, guest speaker.

A historical sketch was read by Mr. Thomas L. Ramsay.

Prior to the erection of this edifice, services were held at stated times by the ministers from Malpeque, but in 1886 preparations were begun towards the building of a church on land donated by William Glover and a tea was held to raise funds.

The building committee consisted of Andrew Bowness, Charles A. MacNutt, William S. Higg, William Walker and John Anderson.

The contractor was James MacKinnon and the painter, John Ramsay. On Saturday, December 25, 1886, the church was completed and the following day, December 26, dedicated by the following ministers: Rev. A. F. Carr, Rev. Alex Roulston and Rev. Mc Hamilton.

The first session comprised William Brown, Robert Humphrey and William Walker.

This place of worship finished and furnished, was 50 feet by 32 feet and a 20 foot wall with a span roof. The entrance was on the end with a stairway on the left leading to the gallery, in which was seated the original choir led by William Walker, precursor. The organ was not purchased until 1901 due to the opposition of a musical instrument in church worship.

The first organist was Miss Margaret Casley and the present one is Mrs. James Jardine.

First Minister in 1888

The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was dispensed in 1888 by the Reverend George MacMillan, W. A. Mason and William Scott.

These clergy served the congregation from the opening of the church until the induction of the first minister, Rev. J. A. MacLeod in 1888. The same year the Sunday School was organized.

The Women's Missionary Society held its primary meeting on January 29, 1891 with the following charter members: President, Mrs. Barbara MacLeod; Vice President, Mrs. William MacLeod; Secretary, Miss Annie Sharpe; and Treasurer, Miss Jane Glover.

At the close of the meeting 22 members were enrolled. This Association, which has always been active has grown so that there are now two organizations in the congregation.

During the pastorate of Rev. A. D. Stirling, the church building was enlarged and improved by the erection of a school room. Hanging on the wall is a framed copy of the farewell address of Rev. John Geddie, first Presbyterian missionary, and was donated by Mr. Albert Simpson. The pulpit Bible was presented by the Glover family.

The fiftieth anniversary was celebrated during the ministry of Rev. W. O. Rhoad when Reverends J. Kier Fraser and T. W. Goodwill were the guest speakers.
