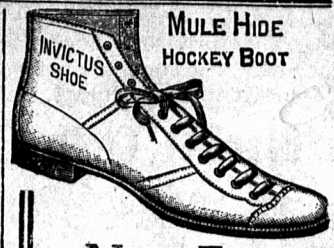

Those who are in the know believe that Mr. Robidoux is destined to take a prominent part in the affairs of Parliament. Of the P. E. Island members, Mr. Nicholson's jolly manner makes friends for him everywhere, and his colleague, Mr. McLean is one of the ablest men in the maritime contingent.—Moncton Exc.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old may homestead a quarter section of a valuable Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Agency on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Must reside upon the home stead or cultivation of the land in each of three years. homesteader must live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 30 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$200 per acre.

Duties.—Must reside upon the home stead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$200 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$500.
