HOT TIME IN OTTAWA

Continued from page 1 immediately before the house closed, on giving reasons why the House should adjourn, Mr. Oliver said that he was about to give his reasons. The matter had been standing for several weeks and was of great importance to the country at large. The speaker, thereupon, quoted rule 39, that the motion to adjourn the house was always in order except when made for the discussion of a definite matter of urgent public importance, in which case, leave must be asked on the orders of the day being taken up. This rule was made for just such cases as the present. Dr. Beland quoted rule 36 as authority for making his motion. The speaker replied that he was not disputing the propriety of moving the amendment. The question was as to what could be discussed under it. Hon. Mr. Pugsley argued that Mr. Oliver was entitled to state his reason why the House should adjourn, although, in the end their reasons might not commend themselves. He again asserted the right of the member for Edmonton to make a motion which would supersede the closure. Speaker Sproule rose to reply to Mr. Pugsley. Mr. Oliver also rose. The Conservative members called upon him to sit down, which, after some hesitation, he did. The speaker then said that the rules had been amended in 1906 for the special purpose of avoiding such motions for adjournment. The English rule was the same. After some further discussion Mr. Oliver explained that he was adopting this course because, under the proposed closure resolutions, such motions would be prevented. Sir Wilfrid Laurier thought that the member for Edmonton must be allowed to state his reasons. The Opposition was threatened with having all their privileges curtailed. During the two weeks sitting on a motion to adjourn, the chairman had ruled that the committee could discuss anything except the matter then under consideration. Premier Borden, stated that when a similar question had arisen a few years ago Sir Wilfrid Laurier had taken the position that there was a distinct difference between a motion to adjourn when a debate was in progress and a similar motion when no debate was in progress. This was supported by the authority of Sir Erakin May. In the one case any subject could be brought up; in the other the matter of the debate was submitted. Bourinot had laid down a similar case. He thought the House would be impressed with the inconvenience and undesirability of introducing a debate such as this one, a motion conveying a closure on minister of the crown. He added that if the matter was of great importance it might be taken up on the orders of the day. He then suggested that the House might rise for dinner and the speaker could, in the meantime, consider the point raised.

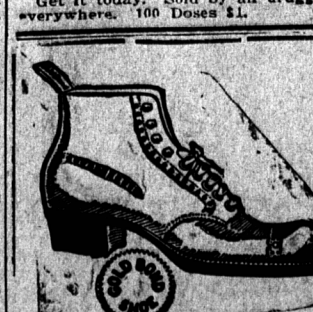
