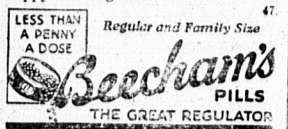

IN MEMORIAM

MRS. A. B. MARTIN

Seldom has the community been more deeply moved than when it learned of the passing on Oct. 12th after a brief illness at her home in Mt. Stewart, of Mabel, beloved wife of Dr. A. B. Martin.

The late Mrs. Martin was a lady of exceptional charm of person and of manner. Even more important was her spirit. This was the personification of willingness. Possessed of a tender and affectionate heart, she delighted to help. Her clever hands and active body were ever at the call of need. Many a pained body was soothed and assisted on the road to health by her gracious ministry.

She rendered devoted service to the United Church of which she was a member, to the Women's Missionary Society, to the Ladies' Aid, to the Women's Institute, the Sewing Circle, the Canadian Legion, the Hospital and other good causes.

She was a great lover of art and of flowers. She found refreshment of body and delight of soul as she worked in her garden. With conspicuous skill she assisted her husband in his medical and surgical work.

To mourn their deep loss, besides her husband, are left the following members of her family, four daughters; Margaret, Florence, Ruby and Constance; her parents Mr. and Mrs. James Inglis of O'Leary, one brother Evans of Kensington, and four sisters, Mrs. Cecil Britt and Mrs. Langford of Shreveport, La.; Mrs. Gotell of O'Leary and Miss Ruby of Saskatchewan.

The funeral service was held from the home on Wednesday, Oct. 14th, and was attended by one of the largest concourses of people in the history of Mt. Stewart.

It was in charge of her minister the Rev. Sydney J. Boyce who had associated with him both at the house and the grave the Rev. Dr. Legate of Charlottetown. The text chosen was "I am among you as he that serveth" (Lk. 22. v. 27.)

Feeling reference was made to the deceased lady's religious faith, love of the church and life of service. The hymns "Nearer My God to Thee" and "Abide With Me" were sung. The Charlottetown Male Octette rendered two beautiful selections "The Lord's My Shepherd" and "No Night There".

Amid many expressions of grief, the cortege proceeded to the Mt. Stewart Cemetery where interment was made. "She rests from her labours and her works do follow her."

The pall bearers were: Messrs. Russel Clark, MacLeod Douglass, Peter Small, Lyle Robinson, William McLeod and Jack McIntyre.

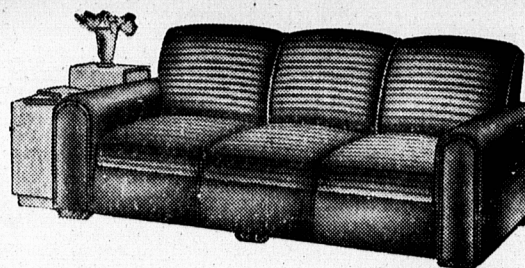

IMMIGRATION PERMITS—(Important) Passengers should be in possession of a letter IN DUPLICATE from their bank manager, clergyman or government official, certifying as to their name and complete address; citizenship; intended length of stay in the United States; and the name and complete address of person to whom destined. The letter should be signed by applicant in the presence of the issuing official. Persons who are NOT citizens of Canada, or British subjects domiciled in Canada, require passports vised by an American Consul. This letter may also be used when re-entering Canada.
