ST HELENA.

The Island of St. Helena, to which Gen. Cronje is now being removed, is situated about 1,000 miles south of the equator, 1,200 miles west of Africa and 1,800 miles east of South America. It is 820 distant from Ascension Island, the nearest land. St. Helena was discovered and named by the Portuguese in 1501 and 150 years later, in 1651, became a British possession. The Island rises precipitously from the sea on all sides, the only place where a landing can be effected being at Jamestown, which is strongly fortified and is also a coaling and naval station. The Island has an area of only 47 square miles, and a population of between four and five thousand, of whom three thousand are in Jamestown.

St. Helena is chiefly famous as the place to which Napoleon Bonaparte was exiled after his defeat at Waterloo. That great battle took place on June 18th 1815. It was nearly a month later, after the capture and occupation of Paris by the Allies, and after a vain attempt to make his escape to America, that he surrendered himself to the British Admiral Hotham at Rochefort on the coast of France. By a unanimous resolve of the Allies he was transported as a prisoner of war to St. Helena, where he arrived October 16, 1815. His place of detention was Longwood, a farmhouse in the interior of the Island and some miles from Jamestown. Here he was closely guarded till his death, caused by cancer of the stomach, took place May 5, 1821.

The great captain was buried at Longwood and his coffin, buried in the rock and fastened down by iron bars and cement, was for many years almost as carefully guarded as his person had been during the six years of his exile. He had left a will, expressing a desire that his remains should repose on the banks of the Seine among the French people. In later years, when Napoleon the Third had ascended the throne of France and had become the ally of Britain, permission was given for the removal of the great Emperor's remains to Paris, where they were entombed in splendid state.

There is a very wide contrast between Cronje and Napoleon in point of greatness, but the safe-keeping of the Boer general just now is a matter of some importance. Cape Town, with a large and sympathetic Dutch population, would neither be so convenient nor safe as St. Helena, and hence the latter place has been selected as Cronje's temporary abode.

Supreme Court.

The Supreme Court met yesterday to deliver judgment in an appeal from a decision of the Judge of Probate arising out of the estate of the late William Dodd. The Chief Justice and Mr Justice Hodgson were on the Bench. Mr Justice Fitzgerald was absent through illness. The question before the Court was whether a grand niece and two grand nephews of the deceased participated in the division of the estate. The deceased William Dodd, died intestate as to a large portion of his personal property. He left behind him one brother, two sisters, one nephew, two grand nephews and a grand niece as his next of kin. The grand nephews and grand niece claimed before the Judge of Probate that they were entitled to a share in the estate and that Judge gave effect to their contention and decided in their favor. From this decision an appeal was taken to the Supreme Court, and heard before the three Judges last month. Yesterday the Court met and gave judgment dismissing the appeal and affirming the decision and decree of Judge Reddin, the Judge of Probate. The judgment of the Supreme Court was unanimous. The Chief Justice, who read the decision of the Court, stated that although Mr. Justice Fitzgerald was absent he concurred in the conclusion reached by him and Mr. Justice Hodgson.
