SETS RECORD
ERMIL WIDE DEFEATS NURMI AND RUNS TWO MILES IN 9 MINUTES, 1 2/5 SECONDS

BERLIN, Sept. 14.—Running two miles yesterday in 9 minutes, one and two-fifths seconds, Ermil Wide, of Sweden, not only settled old scores with Paavo Nurmi, of Finland and outdistanced him by a score or more yards, but established a new world record. Nurmi, too, outdid himself also by beating the previous world record by covering the distance in nine minutes and five seconds. (The previous world's record for two miles was made by the British champion A. Shrubbs, in 1904—9 minutes 9 3/5 seconds.)

He was purchased by Walter M. Reed, of Fort Fairfield, after he had won in 2:06 1/4 over a half mile track in Michigan. Billy Fitch was shipped from Detroit on Thursday.

Wally McWilliams, son of Tom McWilliams, of Portsmouth, N. H., who has done so well with Peterkin, 2:11 1/4, and the rest of the Reel horses is to be Billy Fitch's partner, and the introduction of this newcomer into the select ranks of the fast record pacers had aroused new interest in the free-for-alls.

There is a lot of chatter amongst horsemen as to whether Billy Fitch is going to prove up to battling such a high class racing mare as Bessie McKillo, 2:01 1/4, who the Mooseleuk Club of Presque Isle, nominated to take over John R.

Everyone come and enjoy a week of fun.

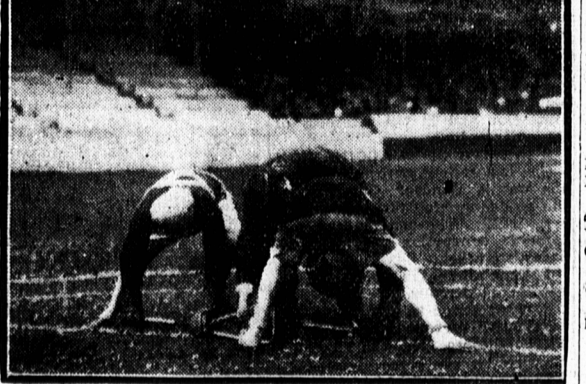

HAS PLAN TO END COCK'S SHRILL CLARION

TORONTO, Sept. 13.—"If they would hang a canvas above the head of the roosters so that they could not stand upright in their cages all the trouble caused by their crowing at the Canadian National Exhibition would cease," declared G. E. Williams, poultry keeper, of 27 Wellington Street West, yesterday.

"It is a fact," continued Mr. Williams, "that a rooster will not crow unless he can stand upright and raise his head to its full height. I use the scheme mentioned to keep my own fowl from causing a disturbance in the early morning hours and it works successfully."

Mr. Williams had read the news article in yesterday morning Globe referring to the annoyance created at the Fair by claret of the fowl on exhibition and offered this plan as a sure method of putting a stop to it.
