Says Nazi Ships Used To Trap British Home Fleet

LONDON, Feb. 18 —(AP)— Col. Lello Portella of the Portuguese general staff said today the "British Admiral's plan was a great tactical feat in letting the German fleet go through the straits in the North Sea" and "very ably evaded" a German trap.

If the home fleet had come out to battle "it would have faced an unexpected brutal air attack which might definitely jeopardize its power, while if the German ships were sunk the loss would be only partial since these battleships probably will not be in condition for action until after complete, lengthy repairs," the Colonel wrote.

Nazis Allege Plot Against Hitler

LONDON, Feb. 18 —(CP)— The German radio was heard tonight to claim that plans against the life of Hitler and his foreign minister, Ribbentrop, had been in possession of the Netherlands foreign minister Erico Kliefers, and that the minister had "attempted to do away with the government of the Reich."

The Germans claimed the documents describing the alleged plot were found among the effects of Edouard Daladier, French premier, and among those of Baron D'Arnould De Vitrolles, former French minister to the Netherlands.

The purpose of the claims was not immediately apparent to observers here unless it should be an attempt to pin accusations on Daladier who is one member of the former French administration awaiting "trial" on charges of having led France to war and defeat.

PURE AIR FOR CHICKS

The health of chicks cannot be maintained when the housing conditions are unhygienic. Light, ventilation and heat in keeping with the age of the chicks, are essential to good health and disease prevention. The dangers of under-heating are well known, but the possible harmful effects of over-heating, are not generally understood, especially in addition to inadequate ventilation. There should be sufficient change of air to avoid stuffiness, remembering that chicks are more sensitive than human beings.

CHECK CARCASS SCALES

In order that hog carcasses may be graded accurately according to weight, the Dominion Department of Agriculture requires that all abattoirs be equipped with scales suitable for weighing each carcass to the exact pound. Many plants are now using automatic registering scales which eject a printed weight ticket for each carcass. These scales are checked daily by the official graders, and the scale operators must be satisfactory to the Department.

ROLL TO REDUCE IS GOOD ADVICE
