WINNIPEG, Oct. 1—(CP)—Liquidation of October wheat contracts and profit-taking weighed wheat futures down from early gains on the Winnipeg grain exchange today. Final quotations were 1 5-8 to 1-2 cent lower, October at \$1.30 5-8, November \$1.30 1-4, December \$1.26 1-8 to 3-8 and May \$1.25 5-8 to 3-4.

Prices moved erratically throughout with longs taking profits on October holdings and re-establishing their lines in distant futures. Hedging pressure was light although receipts of new wheat delivered to country elevators totalled 885,000 bushels yesterday.

Dryden Paper—Earnings continue to run well ahead of last year. Financial Counsel says.

Dominion Foundries—Current dividend 25 cents on common payable Oct. 15 same as previous disbursement of similar amount on July 15.

Mar. Tel and Tel.—Dividend 17 cents payable Oct. 1 adjusts years dividend to 70 cents basis.

Good Year Tire and Rubber—Earnings for 9 months' exceeded dividend requirements on both preferred and common stocks.

Toronto Madsen Red Lake—Located in Red Lake camp about 4 1-2 miles south of Howey Gold should be through shaft at king to 500 feet depth now and crisscutting on three levels towards the indicated ore body. According to drilling officials calculated that in the north zone a length 800 feet of ore was indicated averaging 25 to 30 feet wide and grading about \$6. Recent action of the stock would seem to indicate that work is into the ore, or getting close to it. The background of the mine and corporate picture is the best with such well known mining figures as Joseph McConough, Gen. D. M. Hogarth, C. D. Keating on the board and directing operations. In addition the financial position is very strong with over \$700,000 capital on hand early in the year and ample more funds assured when and if necessary. Options are outstanding on 637,000 shares at \$1 and on million shares at \$1.25 each.

TORONTO, Oct. 1—Canadian Car Pfd. may follow dividend example of National Steel Car. Now the National Steel Car has again entered the ranks of dividend payers. It seems quite possible that Canadian Car and Foundry may shortly follow suit with a dividend on its \$25 preferred stock

which is currently \$7 in arrears. These two companies are the major factors in the railway car business and have been very active this year on large orders from the Canadian railways. In addition, Canadian Car was reported to have recently received a large order for planes which promises to add materially to earnings.

NEW YORK, Oct. 1—The London market opened steady and later American stocks improved in price. The Paris bourse is also better. The Treasury Department indicated yesterday that if there were a revision made in income taxes by Congress that it would not be retroactive to 1937. The Journal of Commerce has a story that President Roosevelt may indicate in St. Paul next Monday whether he will call an extra session of Congress to consider the farm problem. Generally speaking the news this morning is colorless and we would expect a decidedly irregular market. It is interesting to note certain stocks which on the fall break did not break the lows of June, among these were Continental Can, American Can and Paramount. Believe any commitments at this time should be governed by volume.

TORONTO, Oct. 1—Value of shares traded on Toronto S. E. during Sept. increased sharply over the previous month, while share volume was also higher. Transactions totalled 15,216,742 shares, an increase of almost three million over the 12,313,582 of August.

(By The Canadian Press) MONTREAL, Oct. 1 — Butter continued higher on Montreal open produce markets today with eggs slightly easier.

Graded egg shipments in cartons or less were quoted at 36 to 37 cts a dozen for grade A-large, 34 to 35 for A-medium, 30 for A-pullets, 26 for B-large and 21 for C. Butter was quoted at 27 3-8 to 5-8 cents a pound for cartons or less of No. 1 while lots to retailers were 28 1-2 for solids and 29 for prints.

Cheese was quoted at 14 1-4 to 3-8 cents a pound for Ontario whites with coloreds at 14 1-2 to 5-8. Quebecs were sold at 14 for whites and 14 1-8 to 1-4 for coloreds.

Potatoes: Que. new whites No. 1 80's 50 to 55; No. 2 80's 35 to 45; N. B. Cobblers No. 1 80's 60 to 65; P. E. I. new whites No. 1 80's 75 to 80.

Metals picked up 2 to 1.89 in good action and additions up to 15 cents came out for Toburn, San Antonio, Kerr Addison, East Malartic, Hard Rock and Conlarum. Chibougamau, MacLeod, Central Pat and Darkwater settled back slightly.

Royalite dropped a point to 35. Okalta, Calgary and Edmonton, Home, Hargal and Foundation softened a few cents each.
