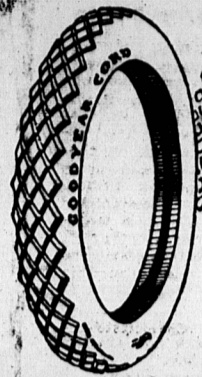

\$3,000,000 PLANT FOR FORT WILLIAM

FORT WILLIAM, Ont., Aug. 17.—The agreement between the city and the company, this will thus Lakes Pulp and Paper Company, represented by L. L. Alstead, of Chicago was signed Saturday by the Mayor and City Clerk, for Fort William, having already been signed by the company. This will thus end negotiations which have been going on for many years involving the controversy over the price of power in the city of Fort William from the Nipigon Development of the Hydro-Electric Commission of Ontario. The company gets power at \$18 per horse-power.

The site selected is on the Kamostiquia River partly in the Township of Neerbing and partly in the city. Plans are already drafted and work on a plant to cost about three million dollars will commence at once. The city and the Township of Neerbing will give a portion of the cost and provide some taxation concessions.
