STOCKS DOWN.—The Montreal market was demoralized yesterday morning, stocks dropping 10 points on a small number of transactions and the Governors of the Exchange decided to close for the afternoon. It was later decided to remain closed Wednesday.

THE PLANT LINE.—The S. S. Halifax, of the Plant Line, arrived in Charlottetown yesterday at noon on her first trip this season, with a fair cargo and the following passengers:—From Boston—Miss G. L. Hopkins, D. J. McDonald, S. Marr, S. E. Lea, Mrs. J. McDonald, Miss M. McKinnon, W. J. Lennahan and wife. From Halifax—H. J. James, C. C. Heinerth. She sailed again at 3 p. m. with the following passengers:—Mrs. Jas. McDonald, Robt. Cousins, Capt. Seimour, W. L. Jordan, Mrs. C. Auld and daughter, Wm. Rodd.

MILITARY REVIEW.—The numbers of troops to participate in the big military review that will take place in Charlottetown during the Confederation Celebration, according to the intimation received by the local military authorities, will be roughly about 1,850 and not two thousand as stated in yesterday's Guardian. Also there is some correction to be made regarding the numbers of the respective units. The local troops, the Light Horse, Fourth Artillery and 82nd Infantry regiments and No. IX. Field Ambulance Corps will parade in the strengths stated yesterday: the same with regard to the 78th Highlanders from Pictou. But the 62nd Regiment, of St. John, N.B., will only send a detachment of 100 n. c. o's. and men with seven officers, and its regimental band (25 strong); while from Halifax will come a detachment from the Royal Canadian Regiment, also a hundred strong with seven officers, and the R. C. R. Band (23 men and one officer). Of the 1,850 about 1,180 will be the number of the P. E. I. units on parade.

SCHOONER IN TROUBLE.—Schooner Weston Light, Capt. Veniot, of Memmingah, P. E. I., came into port this afternoon in a leaking condition and was beached at O'Leary's wharf, says the Richibucto Review of July 23rd. The Weston Light, which was loaded with oats, left Memmingah early this morning for Chatham. Besides her crew she carried several passengers, a young woman being among the number. When near Point Esmeunac the wind came ahead and the vessel was squared away for Richibucto. But for the assistance of the passengers the vessel could not have been kept afloat. Repairs will be made here. Capt. Veniot will sell all or part of his cargo of oats here if possible.
