SCIENTISTS TO PUBLISH A PAPER

The Monitor Will be a Strictly Up-to-Date Newspaper

BOSTON, Mass., Oct. 17.—The Christian Science Sentinel in this week's number, to be issued today, will announce the establishment by the Christian Science Publishing Society of a new daily paper to be known as the Christian Science Monitor. The announcement, which is in the form of an editorial signed by Archbishop McEllan, Editor-in-Chief of the Christian Science periodicals, says in part: "It is the intention of the trustees of the Society to publish a strictly up-to-date newspaper in which all the news of the day that should be printed, will find a place, and whose service will not be restricted to any one locality or section, but will cover the daily activities of the entire world."

MUCH SAUF ACTION OV. P. CONCLUSION

PARIS, Oct. 17.—There is much satisfaction in Government circles over the conclusion, as announced today from London, of a program for the International Conference that is to settle the existing Balkan difficulty. The accuracy of the London announcement of this program is confirmed officially here. Foreign Minister Pinchon, however, points out that Great Britain, France and Russia will not attempt to foist their own ideas on the other signatories of the Berlin Treaty, whose approval will be asked before Russia issues formal invitation. "We do not desire that the powers be divided into groups," M. Pinchon said. Europe must affirm its moral unity and to this end there must be unanimous, equitable and cordial accord. France has done what she could to arrive to result and without ulterior motives she will continue to be a conciliatory agent." Continuing the Foreign Minister said that France was particularly gratified that this crisis had been the means of cementing the France Anglo-Russian entente.

THERE WILL BE NO MORE TIRES.

ROME, Oct. 16.—The invention known as "the granier suspension," which it is asserted will do away with the need of pneumatic tires for automobiles, has proved a complete success in the trip from Rome to Brussels.

All kinds of ground were encountered, and when the car, to which the new device had been fitted, was examined in the Belgian capital, not a screw had loosened, while the engine cradle, which is held in suspension, had no need to be touched—all was as on the day the car left Rome, including the solid rubber tires.

Wherever the pioneers touched—Paris, Brussels, and Liege—they were greeted with cheers, and local experts here say that the pneumatic tire has received its death blow.

PER MILLERS ARE ORDERED TO STRIKE

BERLIN, Oct. 17.—The paper millers working in the Cascade and Riverside Mills, independent concerns were ordered to go out on strike today in a telegram received from the local brotherhood of Paper Makers from President Carlie of the International Brotherhood in Watertown, New York. While the telegram is not explicit, the local paper makers state the trouble comes over the claim that the Independent Mills are making paper for the International Company's mills, where the men have been on strike for several weeks. The strike order today effects one hundred paper makers, who, if they go out will throw six hundred employes altogether out of work. The paper makers had a meeting at which it was decided to send a telegram asking an explanation of the order. Pending receipt of the answer the men will go to work tomorrow morning. Another meeting will be held tomorrow noon. It is understood the order affects paper makers in independent mills in five localities.
