**NEWS OF THE HORSES FROM ALL SOURCES**

MUCH TO THE surprise of the talent, John A. Drake's bay gelding Wes won the Boston cup stake of \$3,000 July 11, at Rockingham Park, defeating Lotus Eaters in 2 minutes 61 seconds record time for a mile and a quarter over this track. Wes kept the lead throughout the race, winning by a length and a quarter. In the third race Zelnap reduced the seven furlong record for the track from 1:28, held jointly by Ostrich and Neptunus, to 1:20.

H. F. Pierce, the well known horseman of Stanstead, Que. purchased at the "Down East" sale the stallion My Chance, 2:17, by Valiant, 2:18; dam Anzola by Popper. He also bought at the same sale the ch. m. Genevieve, 2:12, by May King, out of Mary D. by Almasra. He has evidently secured a pair of good ones. Also a third purchase made by the same gentleman was Octoron (Chimes, a blk. c. 1:28), held jointly by Ostrich and Neptunus, to 1:20.

A GOOD FLY net or sheet will help to keep the team from worrying and chafing themselves, or use loosely-woven sieves. They shield from the hot sun and let in the air, as well as ward off the attacks of flies. Fighting flies cause horses to lose flesh nearly as much as the work. In hitching horses to mowers, binders, etc., see that their traces are not too tightly drawn, lest the top of collar be pressed back and bruise their necks. Never require horses to make a long pull with a heavy load without brief rests, or you may injure their wind. In hot weather, where three or four horses are hitched abreast watch closely the middle horse lest he becomes overheated or windbroken.

GIVE THE MARES in foal good, nutritious food and good care now. Keep the best fillies for brood mares; sell the geldings. The opportunities for improving your horses get better every year. Mud in the barnyard means disease among the horses' feet. Soundness is an indispensable condition if the horse makes money for his owner. Try to raise horses of as uniform quality as possible, but uniformly good. A good walk is a valuable trait in a horse, no matter for what purpose he may be used. A horse may be perfectly proportioned with coach style and action, but without good size he is no coacher.

Nothing should be more gradual than the development of the power of a draft horse or the speed of a trotting horse, and in few other ways are horses more permanently impressed than in pushing their development too rapidly. While it is good taste to have a team of the same color and making, it is good judgment and common sense to have a team of equal strength and power of endurance.

Heaves, frequent coughing and difficulty in breathing in horses, can nearly always be treated by feeding dry, dusty hay. Dampen all hay now before feeding. You cannot make a low-headed horse look tippy and stylish by staining with a light rein, or improve the style of a lofty-headed fellow's appearance. The proper time to begin to handle a colt is the first time you see it. The sooner you begin to teach it submission and gain its confidence the better.

Look for brains as well as feet, limbs or body when buying a horse. An animal that is sound in every member but has not a level head is never a pleasant horse and seldom a valuable one.—Horse Breeder.

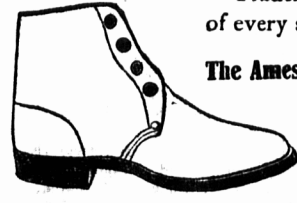
