Selective Revival On New York Stock Exchange

NEW YORK, May 19—(AP)—Belief that the market had been oversold brought a selective revival in today's stock division although many leaders were unable to make the grade and numerous issues touched new lows for the past year or so.

Heavy liquidation in the forenoon knocked pivots for losses of 1 to 4 points. A little bidding then appeared and the pace slowed for a while after mid-day. Actively quickened in the final hour as trends stiffened and gains running to 2 points or more were recorded.

Canadian Pacific, McIntyre and Distillers Seagram each added 1-8 among Canadian issues. Dome Mines was unchanged. On the curb, Lake Shore and Giant Yellowknife each eased 1-8.

Among favorites Chrysler added 2 1-8 at 94 5-8; Standard Oil (NJ) 1 5-8 at 67 3-4; Youngstown Sheet 1 at 55 1-2; Kennecott 1 at 42 1-4; Eastman Kodak 1 1-4 at 45 1-4 and Schenley 2 at 25 1-2.

Ahead were U S Steel, Bethlehem General Motors, Studebaker, Montgomery Ward, Lockheed, United Aircraft, American Telephone, Consolidated Edison, International Nickel, Westinghouse, General Electric, Du Pont, N. Y. Central, Northern Pacific, Southern Railway, Baltimore and Ohio, Atlantic Coast Line, American Woolen, Glenn Martin, Rexall Drug and Pepsi-Cola.

Douglas Aircraft conceded 1 1-4 at 48 3-4; Eastern Air Lines 1 1-4 at 18; American Can 1 1-2 at 85 3-4 and Johns-Manville 1 at 108.
