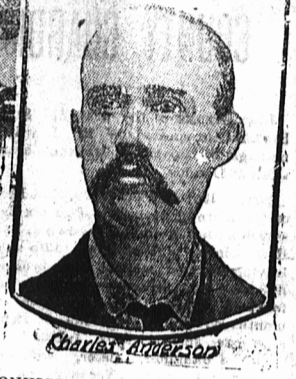

NEW YORK, May 14.—William Ellis Corey, President of the United States Steel Corporation, and Mrs. Corey, whose wedding took place at the Hotel Gotham at half past two o'clock, this morning, left the hotel half an hour later for Hoboken, where they boarded the steamer Kaiser Wilhelm II, on which they sailed for Europe today.

The streets in the vicinity of the hotel, which had been thronged early in the night by a curious crowd, were nearly deserted when Mr. Corey and his bride departed.

This Chateau, which is one of the finest in France, was the wedding gift of Mr. Corey to his bride. It was given to her last night, just before the wedding. Its value is said to be about \$1,000,000.
