Five German Ships Sunk; Two More Damaged By Soviets

Red Armies report continued success on Central Front: Battle for Leningrad still raging.

MOSCOW, Sept. 29—(Monday)—(AP)—Five German ships, including a cruiser, a destroyer, two transports and a tanker, have been sunk and two more destroyers damaged by Soviet naval forces and shore batteries in farflung engagements in Arctic waters and the Baltic and Black Seas, the Soviet information bureau announced early today.
