ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

Interesting Items Gathered by the Guardian.

DURING the past week or two the improvement in the running of the City of London on the East, West Rivers and Belfair routes has greatly improved. The French crew has been all together reloaded by local men many of them including first mate Ryan and Simon I. Blau, cook having to be on the old Jacques Cartier. The engineer Murdoch McLeod of the Elliott has made big improvement in the running of the boat and her speed owing in some cases as much as twelve knots. Passengers and shippers have all expressed themselves pleased with the boat and her popular master Captain Craig.

It is officially stated that the wage difficulty on the I. C. R. east of Toronto has been settled and the strike threatened for May 5 called off. Following this an amicable conference took place between Secretary Moffatt of the P. W. A., a committee from that organization and the management of the I. C. R. The last conference took place on Monday and after the matter had been thoroughly thrashed out, General Superintendent Price of the I. C. R. announced that the road was willing to grant increases varying from seven to fifteen per cent. These terms were accepted and the strike abandoned. The new schedule is to take effect from April 1st last.

On Thursday last Hektor McKinnon, a well known farmer of Burr's Point near Georgetown was taking a seer from Jas. McPherson, and while entering his own gate the wheel struck the gatepost causing Mr. McKinnon to fall backward from the seer upon which he had been sitting, and inflicting injuries upon the neck and spine. It was late in the evening when the unfortunate man was found and carried to his own home when Dr. Stewart was at once summoned, but despite all that could be done he grew worse and died at 3 p. m. Friday. The deceased, who was a widely known and highly respected farmer came to the province some thirty-five years ago and settled near Georgetown, where by his hard and industry he became possessed of a good farm property. He leaves one daughter and four sons who have the deep sympathy of the entire community in their affliction.

SELDOM has the news of death caused more universal sorrow in a community than did the sudden tidings of the decease of Mrs. Nathan A. Orm of Duquas, who died early morning of the 5th inst. news received at 10 o'clock and gave up her spirit to God. She had lived a dearly loved and served faithfully through life. Deceased was in the 57th year of her age, and had been an invalid for many years, but before her end drew near, she was fully resigned and happy to obey the will of her Divine Master. Her life was one of continual self-sacrifice and unselfish devotion to her family. In fact it can be truly said that her charity was everywhere felt, and she will be greatly missed at home especially by the children. Her death was a great loss to the community and the large number of friends who gathered for the funeral on Friday at 2 o'clock was a silent testimony of the grief that was felt for the deceased. The funeral services were conducted by Rev. Mr. McLeod of Duquas. The pall-bearers were Messrs. Ronald McCormack, Jacob Judson, Patrick McPherson, Alex. C. McLeod, James Martin, and R. H. McCormack. She leaves to mourn a sorrowing husband, three sons and one daughter, of whom has gone forth an universal expression of sympathy in the loss of an affectionate wife and a kind and loving mother.
