### JOHN WESLEY ON TEMPERANCE.

The modern total abstinence movement is commonly stated to have begun with the nineteenth century. John Wesley had long before taken very advanced ground in regard to temperance. He was himself not only a total abstainer but a prohibitionist as well, and in that regard far in advance of his times. By the rules formulated by him and his brother Charles in 1743 the members of the Society of Methodists were required to abstain from "drunkenness, buying or selling spirituous liquors or drinking them, unless in cases of extreme necessity" and the first rules of the organizations within the Church known as Band Societies directed the members "to taste no spirituous liquor, no dram of any kind, unless prescribed by a physician."

In 1773 John Wesley said: "In our view and in our practice as a nation there is something fundamentally wrong; and the remedy, like the evil, must be found in the correct application of general principles. It must be a universal and national remedy. What then is this universal, natural and national remedy for intemperance? It is the banishment of strong drinks from the list of lawful articles of commerce by a correct and efficient public sentiment such as has turned slavery out of half our land and will yet expel it from the world. It is amazing that the preparing or selling of this poison should be permitted, (I will not say in any Christian country, but) in any civilized state."

So far was John Wesley in advance of his time. In the light of what is now going on in the world his words read like an inspired prophecy.

### MARITIME CROPS AND STOCK.

Some interesting live stock and crop statistics issued by the Census Department at Ottawa show that the area under crop in this Province in 1907 was 540,228 acres as compared with 483,014 acres in 1901 an increase of 57,134 acres. This is a good showing so far, although New Brunswick shows an increase of 192,831 acres and Nova Scotia an increase of 63,300 acres in the same time. In live stock the Island's showing was not so favorable. There was a decrease of 2,308 cows and 13,973 sheep in this Province, and a gain of 7,381 swine. New Brunswick showed an increase of 22,714 cows, 69,020 sheep and 46,845 swine and Nova Scotia an increase of 15,417 cows, 106,801 sheep and 32,790 swine, in the same period. The hay shortage in 1904-5, and our winter difficulties of transportation are no doubt the causes for the diminished flocks and herds.

An Ottawa despatch to the St. John Sun states that Hon. Mr. Brodeur in reply to Mr. Hughes, (Kings) stated that the Government "would shortly call for tenders for an ice-breaking steamer which will be larger than any now in existence. This is a most extraordinary statement in regard to the size of the new steamer. On the other hand it is disappointing to learn that the tenders have not yet been called for. Mr. Brodeur is further reported

as saying that the builder would have to guarantee that the steamer would be at work in the Straits of Northumberland throughout the winter. The steamers we now have are sometimes "at work" for weeks at a time and doing their best without making a crossing.

The cause of numerous diseases and disagreeable habits, heretofore ascribed as constitutional, have been traced directly to the teeth. Hindness, drooling, robbing, loss of flesh, weak eyes, driving on one rein and pulling are very often due to diseased and irregular teeth. Rough edges and sharp produce nervousness and irritability, uneven and elongated molars and incisors prevent the proper mastication of the food, producing indigestion and general debility. Decayed molars cause necrosis of the bone, abscesses, nasal gleet, etc. These cases should be removed. Decayed teeth should be removed by extracting or trepanning, sharp corners and rough edges should be smoothed down and elongated and uneven molars and incisors cut off. The common float, or file here used, is not sufficient to accomplish this, will not suffice but special instruments devised for the purpose are necessary. 127dttstf
