R. C. BERKINSHAW, C.B.E.

Vice-President and General Manager of Goodyear Tire & Rubber Co. of Canada, Limited, who was elected today President of the Canadian Manufacturers' Association.

Mr. Berkinshaw is a graduate of Trinity College, University of Toronto and Osgoode Hall, Toronto, and was called to the bar in 1916.

He served with the 124th Battalion and with the 12th Battalion, Canadian Engineers, in the First Great War, with the rank of Major and was mentioned in despatches.

During the Second Great War, he was appointed Director-General of the Priorities Branch, Department of Munitions and Supply and was Chairman of the Wartime Industries Control Board.

Montreal Potato Chip Vendors Fight Extinction

MONTREAL, June 3 - (CP) - Street potato chip vendors and their brothers of the whistling carts who sell popcorn, hot dogs and hamburgers are rallying their forces in a fight against extinction of their trade.

Buoyed by the comment of a city councillor that the food they sell is "the barbecue of the laborer," operators of the ambulating chip-and-dog emporiums decided today to obey city by-laws which will force them from the street but to organize under a central committee and hope for the best.

Various city departments decided it would be in the best interests of Montreal if these horse-drawn or motor-driven wagons were forced from the streets. They were termed nuisances to cleanliness, health and traffic.

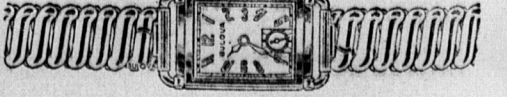
