THE COOK'S CORNER

BRAISED VEAL

Two pounds neck of veal, 1 carrot, 1 turnip, 1 onion, bacon, stuffing and seasonings. Make a stuffing from 2 tablespoons breadcrumbs, 1 tablespoon shredded suet, 1 tablespoon chopped parsley, salt and pepper, and 1 beaten egg to bind.

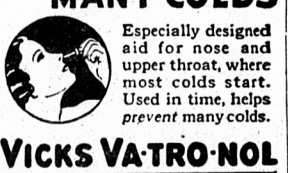
Method: Prepare the following assortment of appetizers and arrange them attractively on an hors d'oeuvre tray.

SCALLOPED SALMON Season choice salmon with rich white sauce, pile into individual buttered ramekins or flat custard cups, top with fine buttered crumbs, bake until heated through.

APPLE COBBLER PIE Rich pastry, 1 cup sugar, 1 tablespoon cornstarch, 1-2 cup cream, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, tart apples, unbaked pastry.

Method: Line deep pie pan with rich pastry, building up high collar on the edge. Mix sugar, cornstarch and cinnamon, spread it over bottom of pastry.

Squares or long Ascot scarfs are favored, worn in soft draped effect, or as typical Ascot ties with the ends tucked into the waistcoat of the suit. Coat necklines are also softened by these scarfs, especially since the tailored yet feminine princess "reefer" coat is a Spring favorite.

FOR AFTERNOON Yellow silk is gala for a'noon. It's lovely in a dress whose bodice and skirt are draped toward the back, where a row of fabric bows add the finishing detail.

DON'T NEGLECT AFTER CARE IN INFLUENZA After a chest cold has abated, the patient should spend three or four days up from bed but indoors, with the room temperature fairly constant, writes Sir Wm. Arbuthnot Lane. Then provided the weather is suitable, that is, dry and sunny (cold in itself is not harmful), a few days should be spent in quiet walks. A week should be regarded as the minimum convalescence after a bronchial cold, and if a few days' change by the seaside can be obtained, so much the better. In the case of influenza the convalescence should be longer, as the general poisoning is more severe, and there is apt to be associated considerable depression of spirits and muscular exhaustion. Inadequate care after influenza may result in years of poor health of mind and body.

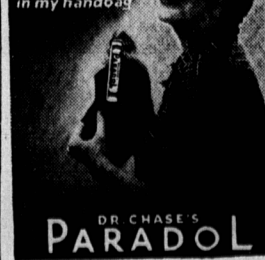
