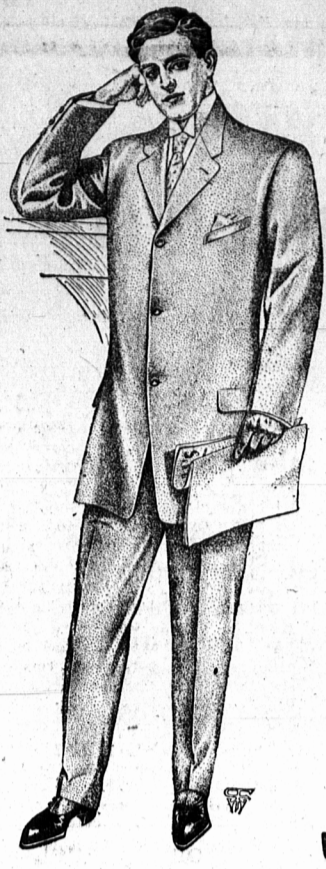

LETTER FROM A SPORTSMAN

J. H. Judson Of Alexandria Comments On Spring Shooting Of Geese And Brant

At the last meeting of the Fish and Game Association at Charlottetown the resolutions were passed to preserve wild geese and brant. Now I do not think the association was doing anything but what they thought was right. To know about shooting birds is a trade or experience. You must understand how to shoot and understand the habits of the birds you shoot at. Wild geese only stay a short time with us in spring on their way to hatching and brant are a little later—coming and stay longer because they want the weather warmer. To go north they gather in very large flocks and starting go around and around until high in the air to fly to their place of hatching. It is said that brant go further north of any of our birds to hatch. To have a close season for geese and brant would be a loss to this Province of several hundred dollars. The poor Indians as well as lots of white men would come short. Indians depend on spring shooting to a large extent of their living; because the making and sale of baskets is seen in the darkness of night as they are in the fall. The geese and brant are only callers here on their way hatching and in autumn coming back from hatching. I say shoot all you can of them, because on their way south, after they start should a storm from the north spring up those birds may carry right across P. E. Island because it is only narrow.

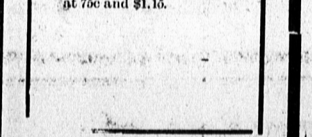

Ultra-Spanish Paper In Havana Talks Strongly On This Matter. HAVANA, Feb. 21.—The Diario Espanol, the organ of the Ultra-Spanish element, in a leading editorial today, referring to the special celebration of the blowing up of the battleship Maine, says: "They commemorate the blackest blot on American history, the world attending the funeral of the victims in full dress uniform, which showed that they must have sent their uniforms ashore, in anticipation of an explosion," and alleges that the reason the wreck has not been raised is that it would conclusively demonstrate that the explosion was in the magazine.

HOW TO TEST FLOUR
