Boston's Mayor-Elect On Trial Yesterday

WASHINGTON, Nov. 27—(AP)—Representative James M. Curley (Dem.-Mass.), Boston's mayor-elect, and four others indicted on mail fraud charges went on trial today after almost two years of postponements.

As the trial got under way before Judge James M. Proctor, the case of David E. Desmond of Boston, a sixth defendant, was severed by the court.

Mr. Curley, 71-year-old former Governor of Massachusetts and former Mayor of Boston, was present in the courtroom as were the four other defendants.

William A. Paisley, special assistant to the attorney general and prosecutor in the case, outlined the charges contained in indictment returned by a Federal Grand Jury Jan. 3, 1944, for the jury panel of about 30 men and women.

The indictment charges that Curley and the others, in various brochures and correspondence sent through the mails between June 20, 1941, and Feb. 28, 1942, represented themselves as being an experienced and competent firm of consulting engineers with special facilities and qualifications for obtaining war contracts from the government.

The indictment adds that the defendants had little or no experience of the services claimed and did not produce any of the services for which they were paid.

In addition to Mr. Curley, who the Justice Department says served as president and director of the firm until Dec. 29, 1941, the defendants are James G. Guller, formerly of Washington; Donald Wake, field Smith, Washington and Pittsburgh; James Burton Underwood, formerly of Washington; Bert Hall, Dallas, Texas, and Tulsa, Okla.; Marshall J. Fitzgerald, formerly of Chicago; and William MacEwen, among the defendants but died after being indicted.
