Placer Mining Claims in the Yukon Territory.

Notice is hereby given that all of the placer mining claims, whole and fractional, the property of the Crown in the Yukon Territory, will be offered for sale at public auction at Dawson, on the Gold Commissioner's office, on the 2nd day of July, 1900. Twenty per cent. of the purchase money shall be paid to the Gold Commissioner at Dawson on the day of sale and the remainder within thirty days from that date. The sale will be by lot and the number of claims which may be sold to any one person or company holding a Free Miner's Certificate but no hydraulic claims will be included in the sale. In case the purchase money has been paid in full, entries for the claims will be made in accordance with the provisions of the Act in relation to the sale of claims, with the exception of the provisions relating to the sale of claims and the claims sold shall thereafter be subject to the placer mining regulations. A survey of the claims sold will be made by the Department as early as possible and the claims shall include ground the Government Surveyor may desire by survey in accordance with such Regulations as may be made in that behalf, and the division of the Gold Commissioner shall in respect thereof be final and conclusive. In case for any reason it is deemed impossible by the Gold Commissioner to give notice of the sale, the Gold Commissioner will effect the deposit paid at the time of sale, and no claim shall be sold to the Crown in respect to failure to give title or possession. A second auction sale under the conditions above set forth, will be held at Dawson on the 2nd day of August, 1900, of all claims not disposed of at the above sale on the 2nd day of July, 1900, and any other claims which have at the meantime become the property of the Crown under the regulations in that behalf. IN THE FAR EAST.

While the reading public has been largely occupied with the events of the war in South Africa and the chances of intervention in that matter by other powers than those immediately concerned, there have been many indications that serious trouble is feared, if not expected in another quarter. There is now little doubt that a new storm centre is forming in the far East, and that the attitude of encroachment and aggrandizement to which both Russia and France are apparently committed in that quarter, is the real cause of present apprehension.

Very recently we have had the apparently concerted action of Great Britain and the United States in sending additional war ships to Chinese waters. The United States Government has despatched thither the Oregon, New Orleans, Newark, Monadnock, Castine and Wheeling. Britain has sent out the Terrible and Argonaut cruisers, the Goliath battleship and some torpedo craft to reinforce her already formidable squadron in those parts. In ordinary the British China squadron consists of three battleships, nine cruisers, seven gunboats, with ten or eleven smaller craft. It will readily be seen that the naval reinforcements now being sent will make a formidable aggregate and must have some more than ordinary reason behind it.

It will hardly have escaped notice that though the British forces now in South Africa are quite as large as can possibly find effective employment in what remains to be completed towards the conquest of the Dutch Republics, other army divisions are being sent thither that seem altogether needless, so far as the present war is concerned. This seems a pretty clear indication that the belief exists that large British armies may be needed either in India or China in the not distant future, and they are being advanced to to half-way station in order to be ready. If the route by way of the Cape seems a roundabout one, it is to be observed that there is yet no sufficient pretext for sending British troops to the East, and should war with France and Russia combined once be entered upon by Britain the route through the Mediterranean and Suez Canal might be somewhat unsafe for our transports.

The concerted action of Britain and the United States does not signify that there is an alliance between the two great English-speaking nations. It simply means that they have great interests in common in China. Britain has laid down and endeavored to secure the "open door" policy there which she has long carried out in every quarter of the world. Her colonies, possessions, dependencies and protectorates are open to the trade of all nations. United States interests are deeply involved in the maintenance of this policy in regard to China, and not long ago the State Department at Washington addressed the Governments of Russia, France and Germany desiring their formal adhesion to the open door principle. These powers have so far declined to give satisfactory written guarantees in that regard, while Russia and Germany mildly objected to the United States Government making representations on the subject. And at the back of this and apparently by the exertion of Russian influence, the Empress Dowager of China has threatened to close the treaty ports of Shanghai, Tien-Tsin and Niew-Chwang.

It seems not likely, in the event of a war arising out of Chinese affairs that Germany would do more than passively protect her own interests. Both Russia and France would be aggressive, the former in the north and the latter in the south of China. Japan would probably take a hand with the Anglo-Saxon powers, moved thereto by her commercial interests and strong antipathy to Russia, which was mainly instrumental in depriving Japan of the just fruits of her victory over China in 1894.

Matters in the far east have, at various times within the past decade assumed a very threatening aspect without leading to actual war. The present threatening clouds may yet be peacefully dispersed and such we hope may prove to be the case, but it will not be surprising if before the end of the current year a number of the great powers are embroiled in a struggle which will dwarf into insignificance the conflict now progressing in South Africa.

GRANT OF LAND.

An Alleged Plan to Induce Them to Settle in South Africa.

A London cable says that a part of the British plan for the pacification of South Africa is now apparent in the announcement that all the British authorities there will make every effort to induce the reservists, the time-expired men, the volunteers and the colonials from abroad to settle there as soon as the war is over by giving them 240 acres of land each, provided they will occupy the land for ten years.

British Insuring Public Taxed

A curious feature of the war in South Africa and one which illustrates the long-headedness of Uncle Kruger, is the fact that British insurance companies have been compelled to carry without extra premium the risks on the fighting Boers. When they applied for the privilege of doing business in the Transvaal, it was stipulated that Boers insured should be allowed to serve in war on ordinary insurance rates. The result now is that the British companies have one class of policyholders killing off another class of policyholders and the British insuring public will in the long run have to foot the bill.

The Famine Stricken in India.

It is estimated that by March 31st Great Britain will have spent over \$15,000,000 for the relief of the famine stricken in India. The population of the district affected is about 21,000,000, and the year's crops are total failure. Unfortunately for these poor people the stream of British beneficence has been diverted to South Africa, and those dependent on the soldiers out there so that there is likely to be more suffering than ever. Very little food will grow this year on 300,000 square miles of the worst of the famine region.
