### Farmers' Attention re Hogs.

TO THE FARMERS OF P. E. ISLAND.

We wish to ask you not to kill any hogs until you first see us or our buyers (who are at all the principal shipping points on the Island) regarding the marketing of same. We can only handle a limited quantity each day, but when this number is exceeded, which it has been of late, we have a great amount of waste in order to take care of the most valuable parts. This waste can only be covered by reducing the price of the hogs and is no gain to us but a big loss to you. You can thus see the necessity of regulating the supply.

When the weather turns colder an outlet will be found for any hogs not handled here and at better prices than at present, so you have everything to gain by adopting this plan. We may say the majority of the hogs being marketed at Charlottetown particularly are not sufficiently fed and require another two or three weeks feeding.

Early in the year we hope to arrange a meeting, of which you will receive due notice, with delegates from all parts of the Island, with a view of planning for the future re this matter.

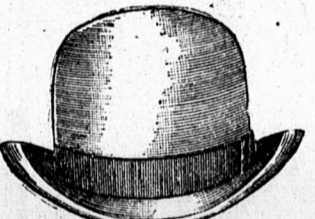
