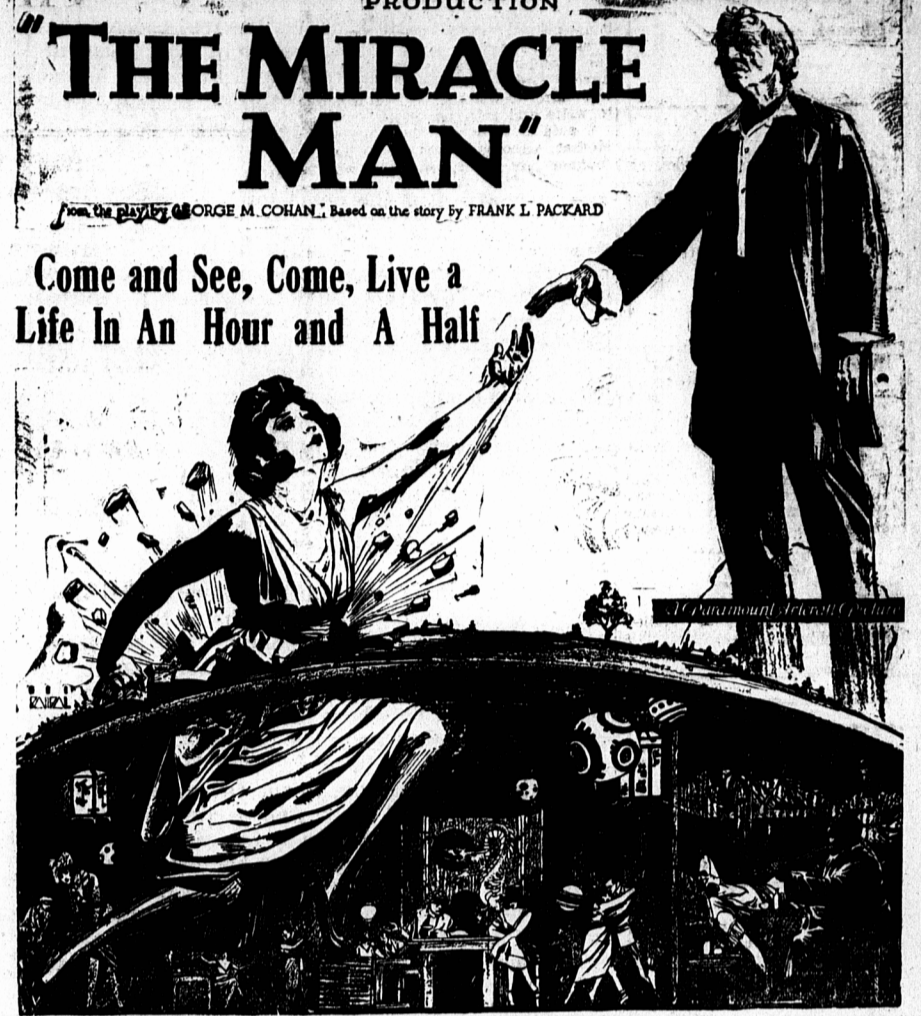

Polish Chief Captures Vilna

LONDON, Oct. 11.—Europe had another flame incident today in the capture of the Lithuanian capital of Vilna by hastily organized troops under the Polish General Zeligowski. Zeligowski who was officially repudiated by the Polish authorities was said to have been elected to the command of the Polish residents of Vilna. The Lithuanian Government withdrew to Kovno. The Lithuanian legation here bitterly denounced Poland claiming Zeligowski's coup was instigated by his Government.

MORE DISTURBANCES IN IRELAND

DUBLIN, Oct. 11.—With Sinn Fein attacks on military renewed, Ireland today awaited further police reprisals. One officer was killed and four others wounded Sunday when Sinn Feiners ambushed two motor lorries near Newcestown. Eight soldiers were reported missing following the blowing up of a motor lorry near Castle Rea, County Roscommon. Attacks on soldiers and police were reported at Belfast.

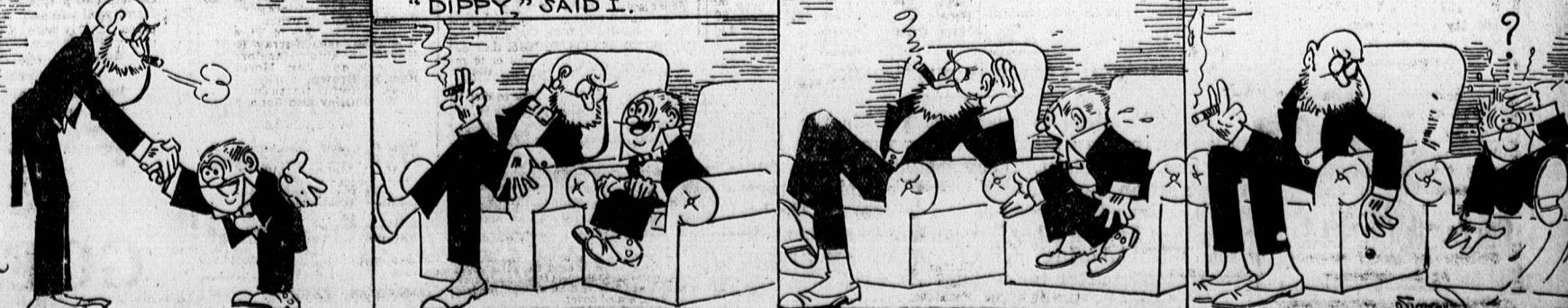
