### Stock Markets At A Glance

CHICAGO, July 23 (AP)—Belief that internal strife may result in the sudden collapse of Germany prompted liquidation of grain futures Saturday and all markets showed a heavy undertone.

WINNIPEG, July 23 (CP)—Rye futures slipped 1/2 cent in moderate active trading Saturday on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange. July closed at \$1.57 1/2, October \$1.68 1/2, December 1.07 1/2, and May 1.10 1/2. Good support by commission houses during the session led to sharp heavy selling by American interests.

NEW YORK, July 23 (AP)—Sellers continued to blast the Stock Market Saturday and leading stocks, rails, motors and pivotal industries conformed from the worst week in nearly a year, or since the fall of 1931, with scant recovery in sight.

The Associated Press 60-stock average was down 5 of a point at 5 43 where it was back to about its level of mid-June.

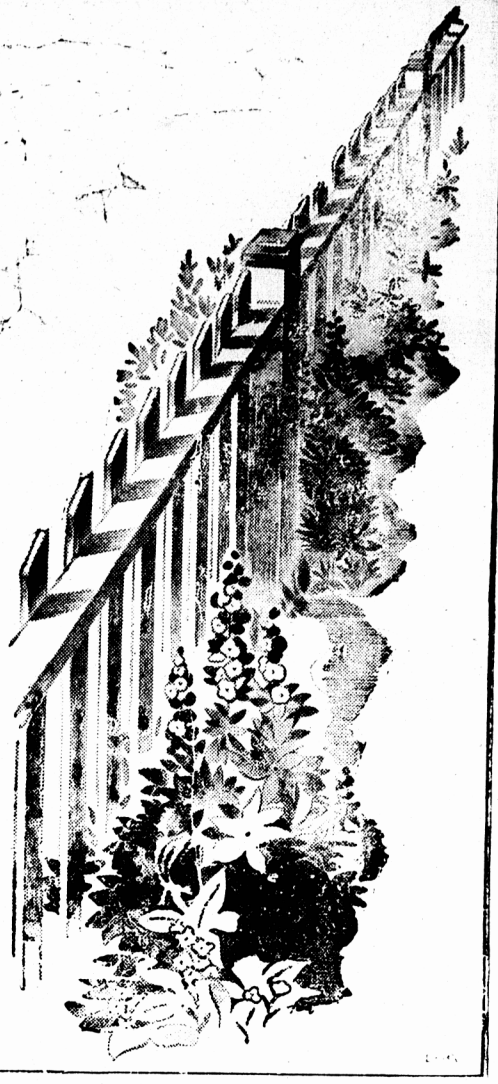
